The Judge of this Court having this day entered a Decree granting the application of the Complainant for a temporary restraining order or temporary injunction against the Respondent, its officers, agents, servants or employees, and those acting in concert with it, from enforcing or attempting to enforce its Ordinance Numbered 101, dated, adopted and approved on the 4th day of February, 1957, against the Complainant in this cause; and further that the Register of this Court issue such injunction or restraining order upon the Complainant entering into a good and sufficient bond, conditioned as provided by law, in the sum of \$500.00, to be approved by the Register.

Now comes Robert E. Godsey, the Complainant in the above styled cause, and presents unto the undersigned a good and sufficient bond in accordance with the terms of the Decree, aforesaid, which said bond is approved by the undersigned as Register.

Upon consideration of all of which it is, therefore

ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED by the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, In Equity, in accordance with the Decree of said Court entered on March 15, 1957, at 10:14 o'clock A. M. as follows:



that the ordinance complained of violates Section 6 of Article 1 of the Declaration of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

10. That the allegation of the bill of complaint that the said ordinance, Exhibit "A", violates Section 35 of Article 1 of the Declaration of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Alabama is a conclusion of the pleader.

11. That the said bill of complaint sets up no facts showing that the said ordinance violates Section 35 of Article 1 of the Declaration of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

12. That the allegation of the said bill of complaint that the ordinance, Exhibit "A", violates the 14th Amendment of the Constitution of the United States is a conclusion of the pleader.

13. That the said bill of complaint sets up no facts showing that the said ordinance violates the 14th Amendment of the Constitution of the United States.

14. That the allegation of the said complaint shows that the tax levied under ordinance, Exhibit "A", is operative on all persons, firms, and corporations engaged in the class of business taxed thereby.

15. That the allegation of the said bill of complaint shows on its face that the tax levied by ordinance, Exhibit "A", is not discriminatory.

16. The complaint shows on its face that the tax levied under ordinance, Exhibit "A", applies to all persons alike engaged in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants in the City of Foley.

17. That the Complaint shows on its face that the said ordinance taxes persons engaged in the business of marketing trading stamps is a lawful exercise of the police power of the City of Foley.

18. The allegation of the said bill of complaint shows on its face that the tax levied under ordinance, Exhibit "A", is a lawful exercise of the taxing power of the City of Foley.

19. The complaint shows on its face that the levy of the tax by the City of Foley on persons engaged in the business of marketing trading stamps is a lawful and reasonable classification.

20. That the said bill of complaint alleges no facts showing that the tax levied on all persons marketing trading stamps is discriminatory.

21. That the said bill of complaint alleges no facts showing that the tax levied on all persons marketing trading stamps is an unlawful exercise of the taxing power of the City of Foley.

22. Said bill of complaint shows on its face that the tax levied on that class of business and that business engaged in the marketing of trading stamps is a lawful tax on that class of business.

23. The fact, as alleged in the bill of complaint, that merchants issuing their own trading stamps and advertising devices are not taxed, does not under the laws of the State of Alabama render the tax levied by said ordinance, Exhibit "A", on business engaged in the business of marketing trading stamps thereunder discriminatory and void.

24. The fact that ordinance, Exhibit "A", does not apply to persons issuing coupons or certificates furnished by a manufacturer or compounder as a part of the original package or item of merchandise and distributed in connection with that one commodity only, nor to persons issuing coupons or certificates exclusively on one private brand product only is not sufficient to authorize this court to grant relief prayed for.


25. The fact that the ordinance, Exhibit "A", does not apply to persons issuing coupons or certificates furnished by a manufacturer or compounder as a part of an original package or item of merchandise and distributed in connection with that one commodity only, nor to persons issuing coupons or certificates exclusively on one private brand product only does not invalidate the levy of the tax on this complainant.

26. The fact that the provisions of the ordinance are not applicable to merchants who issue their own stamps or similar devices does not render the tax levied by the ordinance, Exhibit "A", unconstitutional and is not an arbitrary, capricious and void classification without just basis or reason.

27. Even though the provisions of said ordinance not being applicable to merchants who issue their own stamps or similar

devises should render said provision unconstitutional such invalid provision would not invalidate the whole ordinance, nor render unconstitutional the tax levied thereby against the business engaged in by the complainant.

AND TO THE HONORABLE HUBERT M. HALL, JUDGE THEREOF:

Comes the Complainant, Robert E. Godsey, in his own proper person and by his Solicitors, and respectfully represents and shows unto Your Honor and unto this Honorable Court as follows:

FIRST:

That the Complainant is over the age of twenty-one years and is a resident citizen of the State of Alabama and of Foley, Baldwin County, Alabama, wherein he resides. That the Respondent, City of Foley, Alabama, is a municipal corporation organized and existing under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alabama, possessing the authorities and powers granted to it by such Constitution and Laws, and its corporate limits lie wholly within the boundaries of Baldwin County, Alabama.

SECOND:

That the Complainant owns, operates, conducts and manages a filling station business within the corporate limits of the City of Foley, Alabama, his business consisting of the sale of petroleum, petroleum products, tires, batteries, automobile accessories and related merchandise to the general public at retail prices, and the sale of services in the repair and maintenance of motor vehicles. That the Complainant's business is known as "Godsey's Gulf Service".

THIRD:

That on February 4, 1957, the City Council of the City

of Foley, Alabama, the Respondent herein, adopted "An Ordinance to define trading stamps; to regulate the act of marketing trading stamps; to levy a privilege license tax upon persons, firms, associations, partnerships and corporations marketing trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction; to make it unlawful to market trading stamps to or through merchants or vendors in the City of Foley, without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide penalties for such violation; to make it unlawful for any merchant or vendor in the City of Foley to give or market with the sale of merchandise or services, the trading stamps of any person, firm, association, partnership or corporation which has not first procured a license from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction, and to provide penalties for such violation, and to make it unlawful for merchants to use trading stamps to be given or sold with any merchandise or service without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide a penalty for such violation, and for other purposes.", which ordinance is hereinafter referred to as the trading stamp ordinance, a copy of which is attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, which trading stamp ordinance was approved by W. Max Griffin, as Mayor of the City of Foley, Alabama, on February 4, 1957, which copy is marked "Exhibit A".

FOURTH:

That on December 3, 1956, the City Council of the City of Foley, Alabama, the Respondent herein, adopted "An Ordinance to provide a schedule of License Fees for the City of Foley, Alabama; require the taking out of license before engaging in any business, trade, occupation, vocation, profession or exhibition; to provide for the issuance of such license; to provide a penalty for any violation of this ordinance, and for other purposes.", which ordinance is hereinafter referred to as the general license ordinance and schedule, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit B" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, which general license ordinance and schedule was approved by W. Max Griffin, as Mayor of the City of Foley, Alabama, on December 3, 1956. That

the Complainant has paid all of the license fees, and there has been issued to him all licenses, prescribed by said general license ordinance and schedule which are applicable to, and required of, the business operated by the Complainant aforesaid; and he has, in all respects, fully complied with all of the terms, provisions and requirements of said general license schedule and ordinance.

FIFTH:

That the Complainant did, in the course and conduct of his business aforesaid, on February 15, 1957, and he did, in the course and conduct of his business aforesaid, on each subsequent day thereafter up to and including the date on which this Bill of Complaint was filed, give or issue to the customers of his said business a trading stamp known as an "S&H Green Stamp" for each ten cents (10¢) paid in cash by each of his customers for the purchase of the products and services which he is now engaged in selling, and which he was on the dates hereinabove referred to engaged in selling. That the trading stamp or stamps given or issued by the Complainant aforesaid is and are substantially the same as the stamp which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit C" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein. A customer paying cash to the Complainant and receiving trading stamps from the Complainant as set forth above collects the stamps and pastes them in a book, substantially the same as the book which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit D" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, and when at least one book has been filled with said stamps (1200 stamps being required to fill one book) the customer may surrender the filled book to The Sperry And Hutchinson Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey and qualified to do business in the State of Alabama, for redemption in merchandise, or may surrender to said corporation, for redemption in merchandise, a filled book, or books, and fractions of books, as set forth in the catalogue of merchandise available to customers collecting said stamps, a copy of which catalogue is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit E" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein; all under and pur-

suant to a contract entered into by and between the Complainant and The Sperry And Hutchinson Company aforesaid, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit F" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein. The average retail value of the merchandise given in redemption of one book of stamps is Three Dollars (\$3.00), of two book Six Dollars (\$6.00), etc. There is no element of chance or deception in the system employed by the Complainant under the terms of the contract shown as "Exhibit F" and this system constitutes an effective system of sales promotion and advertising for the Complainant. All customers paying cash to the Complainant for the products and services which he is engaged in selling receive stamps on an equal and uniform basis and are able to definitely ascertain the value of the stamps by reference to the catalogue of The Sperry And Hutchinson Company, aforesaid.

SIXTH:

That since the adoption and approval of the trading stamp ordinance and subsequent to the compliance by the Complainant with the terms and provisions of the general license ordinance and schedule the Complainant was, on February 15, 1957, and has been on each subsequent day thereafter, served by an officer, agent, servant or employee of the Respondent with a "Citation To Appear In Municipal Court" to answer to a charge of violating the trading stamp ordinance by giving or issuing trading stamps as therein defined without first having obtained a license as prescribed by said trading stamp ordinance under a complaint made by the Respondent herein. That on February 20, 1957, in answer to said citations, the Complainant appeared in the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, to answer the charges made against him on February 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th, respectively, by the Respondent; and he was on said date and in said Court tried by the Judge thereof and convicted of said alleged violation and fined Twenty-five and No/100 Dollars (\$25.00) for each of said alleged violations on each of said dates, or a total of One Hundred and Fifty and No/100 Dollars (\$150.00), plus the costs of Court. That on February 20, 1957, and immediately after the trial aforesaid and in open Court and before the same ad-

journed, the Complainant gave Notice of Appeal to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and the judge of said Municipal Court thereupon fixed an appeal bond in the penal sum of Three Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$300.00) conditioned on the appearance of the Complainant at the next term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and from term to term thereof thereafter until discharged, and abide by and perform whatever sentence may be adjudged against the Complainant, in answer to the alleged violation of said trading stamp ordinance. That the Complainant at said time and place did execute said appeal bond which was then and there approved by the judge of said Court. That on February 27, 1957, in answer to citations served as aforesaid on the dates hereinafter set forth and requiring the Complainant to answer to a charge of violating the trading stamp ordinance by giving or issuing trading stamps as therein defined without first having obtained a license as prescribed in and by said trading stamp ordinance under a complaint made by the Respondent, the Complainant appeared in the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, to answer the charges made against him on February 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th and 27th, respectively, by the Respondent; and he was on said date and in said Court tried by the Judge thereof and convicted of said alleged violations and fined Twenty-five and No/100 Dollars (\$25.00) for each of said alleged violations on each of said dates, or a total of One Hundred and Seventy-five and No/100 Dollars (\$175.00), plus the costs of Court. That the Complainant did thereupon make and execute an appeal bond in the penal sum of Four Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$400.00) conditioned as hereinabove set forth and which was approved by the judge of said Court all as hereinabove set forth, after first having given Notice of Appeal to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama. That since the 27th day of February, 1957, there has not been a session of the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, and the charges represented by the citations which have been served on the Complainant since said date are now pending in said Court and the Complainant has been commanded to appear therein on March 9, 1957, at 4:00, P. M., to answer said charges. That the Complainant has now appealed thirteen (13) separate cases to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, from the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Ala-

bama, each involving the alleged violation by the Complainant of the trading stamp ordinance as aforesaid. That the continued enforcement of the trading stamp ordinance by the Respondent, acting by and through its officers, agents, servants or employees, will cause serious and irreparable injury and damage to the Complainant and he will thereby be deprived of the right to conduct his business in a lawful and legitimate manner and be deprived of valuable property rights. The presence of the officers, agents, servants or employees of the Respondent at the place of business of the Complainant for the purpose of serving the citations hereinabove referred to is, and has been, a matter of continuing embarrassment to the Complainant in the conduct of his said business and constitutes an unlawful and detrimental interference by the Respondent in the conduct and management of a lawful and legitimate business.

SEVENTH:

That the giving or issuance by the Complainant to his said customers of said trading stamps in the conduct and management of his said business does not affect the health, safety, welfare or morals of the citizens of the City of Foley, Alabama, and such manner of conducting and managing the business of the Complainant is not affected with a public interest.

EIGHTH:

That under the terms and provisions of the trading stamp ordinance merchants in the City of Foley, Alabama, may offer cash discounts to their customers without the use of trading stamps or they may advertise and promote their business by means other than the use of trading stamps and they are not required to obtain licenses or to pay a tax similar to that provided in the trading stamp ordinance.

NINTH:

The trading stamp ordinance is unconstitutional and is void and of no force and effect for the following reasons, separately and severally:

1. The ordinance is discriminatory in that it requires the Complainant and other merchants issuing or giving trading stamps to their customers to pay a tax on their gross receipts at a rate and in an amount therein prescribed and does not impose the same on other businesses in competition with the Complainant or the other merchants giving or issuing trading stamps.

2. The ordinance is discriminatory in that it does not impose a license tax upon retail merchants in the City of Foley, Alabama, who offer to the public their own trading stamps, coupons, tickets, certificates and similar advertising and promotional devices.

3. The enactment of the ordinance was beyond the authority of the City of Foley, Alabama.

4. It violates Article 1, Section 35, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

5. It violates the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America in that it denies the Complainant equal protection of the laws.

6. It violates Article 1, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama in that it deprives the Complainant of property and liberty without due process of law.

7. It violates the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America in that it deprives the Complainant of property and liberty without due process of law.

8. It is an attempt under the guise of a license tax to fix a penalty on the Complainant for conducting his business in a manner which is not detrimental to the health, welfare, safety or morals of the citizens of the City of Foley, Alabama.

9. It violates Article 1, Section 1, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama in that it is an attempt to impose a license on the method of conduct of a legitimate and lawful business.

10. It is an attempt under the guise of a revenue measure to exercise police power over a manner or method of conducting a legitimate business which manner or method does not offend public morals and does not work an injury to the public.

11. It is an unlawful exercise of the police power of the Respondent.

12. It deprives the Complainant of equal protection of the laws in that it discriminates between the Complainant and others in the City of Foley, Alabama, or its police jurisdiction, engaged in the same business as that of the Complainant, by imposing upon the Complainant an exceptional burden.

TENTH:

That the Complainant has no adequate remedy at law for the redress of the serious and irreparable injury and damage which he will suffer, and which he has suffered, through the continued enforcement by the Respondent of the trading stamp ordinance.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS


The premises considered, the Complainant respectfully prays that the City of Foley, Alabama, a municipal corporation, be made a party Respondent to this Bill of Complaint and that the usual writ of process issue out of this Honorable Court requiring it to plead, answer or demur hereto within the time allowed by law and under the rules of this Honorable Court.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

The premises considered, the Complainant respectfully prays that upon the filing of this Bill of Complaint that this Honorable Court will grant to the Complainant a temporary injunction restraining and enjoining the Respondent, its officers, agents, servants and employees, and those acting in concert with it, from in any manner or by any means attempting to enforce the trading stamp ordinance, or initiating or prosecuting any proceeding against the Complainant for any alleged violation of said ordinance, pending this litigation. And the Complainant further prays that upon a final

hearing of this cause that this Honorable Court will enter an order and decree declaring the trading stamp ordinance unconstitutional and void and of no force and effect and will, in and by the terms of said order and decree, permanently enjoin and restrain the Respondent from enforcing, or attempting to enforce, said ordinance, or from initiating or prosecuting any proceeding against the Complainant to enforce the provisions thereof. And the Complainant prays for such other, further and different relief to which he may be entitled in the premises.

EXHIBIT A

AN ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 101

An Ordinance to define trading stamps; to regulate the act of marketing trading stamps; to levy a privilege license tax upon persons, firms, associations, partnerships and corporations marketing trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction; to make it unlawful to market trading stamps to or through merchants or vendors in the City of Foley, without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide penalties for such violations; to make it unlawful for any merchant or vendor in the City of Foley to give or market with the sale of merchandise or services, the trading stamps of any person, firm, association, partnership or corporation which has not first procured a license from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction, and to provide penalties for such violation, and to make it unlawful for merchants to use trading stamps to be given or sold with any merchandise or service without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide a penalty for such violation, and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF FOLEY, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as Trading Stamps Ordinance No. 101 of the City of Foley, Alabama, of February 4, 1957.

Section II: It is not intended by this ordinance to repeal, abrogate, annul, or in any way impair or interfere with existing provisions of other laws or ordinances except those specifically repealed by this ordinance.

Section III: Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, and words shall have the meaning given herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense included the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directive.

(a) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "trading stamps" shall also include and mean coupons, certificates, and other similar devices which are redeemable or to be used for anything of value.

(b) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "Person" shall include firm, association, partnership and corporation.

(c) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "Marketing" shall also include and mean selling for cash or anything of value.

(d) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "merchants" shall include persons, firms and corporations who sell services or property, both real and personal.

Section IV: For the purpose of this ordinance trading stamps are and shall be presumed to have been marketed to the merchant by the person responsible for their redemption when the merchant gives or markets the trading stamps of such person in connection with the sale of property (both real and personal) or services

by the merchant.

Section V: Every person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants within the city limits of Foley shall pay to the City of Foley the annual license of \$2,500.00, and shall pay in addition thereto a sum equal to that paid by every merchant, firm, or corporation to whom these stamps are marketed, as set out in Section X hereof, for the privilege of engaging in such business within the municipality, which license shall be due and payable at the time such person engages in such business, or on January 1st of each calendar year, whichever occurs first, and such person shall have first qualified to engage in such business as hereinafter provided.

Section VI: Every person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, But not in the city limits of the City of Foley, shall pay an annual license fee of \$1,250.00 and shall pay in addition thereto a sum equal to that paid by every merchant, firm or corporation to whom these stamps are marketed as set out in Section X hereof, for the privilege of engaging in such business within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, which licenses shall be due and payable at the time such person engages in such business, or on January 1st of each calendar year, whichever occurs first.

Section VII: Before engaging in the business of marketing trading stamps within the city limits or police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, every person shall make application for license from the City of Foley through its clerk who shall require the applicant to supply certified statement of the last audit report of the company responsible for redeeming the trading stamps sought to be marketed. The clerk shall not issue a license to persons for the privilege of marketing trading stamps until he has received the foregoing statement and submitted it to the city council for its approval and authorization. The city council may require such other statements and affidavits from the applicant as it might deem necessary for the protection of the public, before authorizing the issuance of such license.

Section VIII: The agents or representatives of persons who engage in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants in this city shall be personally responsible for the compliance of their principals and of the business they represent with this ordinance.

Section IX: It shall be unlawful for any person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants in the City of Foley without first having procured a license as provided for herein and each day in which said business is so engaged shall constitute a separate offense.

Section X: Each merchant who gives or markets in any manner the trading stamps shall be required in addition to all other licenses, to pay to the city on each separate place of business in which any part or phase of the business of issuing, selling, giving or other distributing of such trading stamps occurs, an annual license as follows: where the gross receipts from any such place of business for the year next preceding was:

not over \$100,000.00	-	\$200.00
more than \$100,000.00 but not over \$150,000.00	-	\$300.00
more than \$150,000.00 but not over \$200,000.00	-	\$400.00
more than \$200,000.00 but not over \$250,000.00	-	\$500.00
more than \$250,000.00 but not over \$300,000.00	-	\$600.00
more than \$300,000.00 but not over \$350,000.00	-	\$700.00
more than \$350,000.00 but not over \$400,000.00	-	\$800.00
more than \$400,000.00 but not over \$450,000.00	-	\$900.00
more than \$450,000.00 but not over \$500,000.00	-	\$1,000.00
all over \$500,000.00	-	\$1,500.00.

As used in this Section, the term "gross receipts" shall mean the entire receipts from the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services without regard to the issuance of trading stamps, and as a part of the application for license, a statement under oath must be submitted to the city clerk showing the gross receipts and shall be executed by the owner, if an individual enterprise, by a partner, if a partnership, or by the President, if a corporation.

Section XI: The annual license for a merchant within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, but not in the city limits of the City of Foley, will be one-half of the amount as shown in Section X above, and all other requirements thereof must be met.

Section XII: It shall be unlawful for any merchant as hereinabove defined who does business in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction to give or market with the sale of merchandise the trading stamps of any person who has not first procured the license herein required from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the city or its police jurisdiction, and each day in which said merchant violates the foregoing provision shall constitute a separate offense.

Section XIII: The license imposed by this ordinance shall not apply to persons issuing coupons or certificates furnished by a manufacturer or compounded as a part of an original package or item of merchandise and distributed in connection with that one commodity only.

Section XIV: Any Section of this ordinance which may hereinafter be held invalid or unconstitutional, shall in no way affect or impair the validity and enforceability of any other Section hereof.

Section XV: And any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined not more than \$100.00 to which may be added, in the discretion of the Judge of the Court trying the case, confinement to jail and to hard labor for the city, for a period not to exceed six months, and each day of violation shall be considered as a separate offense.

EXHIBIT B

ORDINANCE NO. 98

An ordinance to provide a schedule of License Fees for the City of Foley, Alabama; require the taking out of license before engaging in any business, trade, occupation, vocation, profession or exhibition; to provide for the issuance of such license; to provide a penalty for any violation of this ordinance, and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOLEY, ALA., AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association, or the agent of any person, firm, Corporation or association, to engage in any exhibition, trade, business, vocation, occupation or profession within the corporate limits of the City of Foley, Alabama, or within the police jurisdiction of said City of Foley, without first having applied for, procured and paid for a license for such exhibition, trade, business, vocation, occupation or profession, according to the schedule of license and license fees set out in Article Two hereof.

ARTICLE II

Section 1: The following is the schedule of exhibitions, trades, businesses, vocations, occupations or professions referred to in Article One hereof, together with the amount of the license fee therefor:

Insurance Companies: Other than Fire and Marine: each insurance company other than fire, marine and fraternal shall pay an annual license of \$10.00 plus \$1.00 on each \$100, and major fraction thereof of gross premiums, less return premiums, on policies issued during the preceding year to citizens of the City of Foley Ala., providing that in case such company shall not have conducted business for the

full period of said preceding year, it shall pay \$10.00 plus one per cent of that amount which bears the same relationship to the gross amount of premiums, less return premiums, on policies issued during said preceding year as 365 bears to the number of days during which business after the first of the current license tax year shall pay \$10. plus \$1. on each \$100. and major fraction thereof of gross premiums, less return premiums, on policies issued during the said current year to citizens of the said City of Foley, Ala. Section 2: Any person, firm, corporation, or association, or any agent for any person, firm, corporation or association, engaged in or carrying on any of the foregoing exhibitions, trades, businesses, vocations, occupations or professions within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, Alabama, shall pay a license equal to one-half (1/2) of the Tax Schedule in Section 1 of Article Two hereof, except that no additional tax shall be due from any Public Utility, Railroad Company, Telegraph Company, Telephone Company, or Express Company.

ARTICLE III.

Section 1: All license shall be due January 1st of each year and shall be annual licenses, except where a license by the day, week or month is hereinbefore provided for. In case the license of any business, trade, occupation, vocation or profession shall become due and be taken out after the first of July, only one-half of the license shall be charged and collected, except those for which daily, weekly or monthly licenses are provided. No license shall be transferred more than once, and never from one business to another.

Section 2: Any person dealing to engage in any trade, business, profession or occupation for which a license is required shall designate the place for any at which such trade, business, occupation or profession is carried on, and the license to be issued hereunder shall designate such place, and such license shall authorize the carrying on of such trade, business, occupation or profession only at the place designated unless permission is granted by the Council to remove such business, trade, occupation or profession to another place in the City of Foley, and in that event such permission shall be endorsed by the Town Clerk on such license.

Section 3: Any person, firm, corporation or association, or the agent for any person, firm, corporation or association, dealing in two or more of the businesses, vocations, occupations or professions for which a license is required shall take out and pay for a license for each line of business, vocation, occupation or profession.

Section 4: The Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Foley, Alabama, shall have the power and authority to issue all licenses provided for in this ordinance, and shall have the power and authority to require sworn statements as to the amount of capital, stock of goods, amount of sales, stock invested, value of goods or receipts from the business, where the amount of license, is made to depend thereon; and any person, firm, corporation or association, or the agent for any person, firm, corporation or association, failing or refusing to make such sworn statement, when required to furnish the same to the proper officer of the City of Foley, shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance.

Section 5: The Mayor and the City Clerk shall issue all such licenses and charge a fee of twenty-five (25) cents therefor, and to all licenses not taken out by March 1st of each year, a penalty of 15% shall be added.

ARTICLE IV.

Section 1: Any person, firm corporation or association, or the agent of any person, firm, corporation or association, who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than one dollar, nor more than one hundred dollars, and be imprisoned not exceeding six (6) months, either or both, at the discretion of the Mayor, for each offense, and each day that such violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 2: This ordinance shall be effective January 1, 1957, after first having been published one time in The Foley Outlooker.

Section 3: Any or all provisions of any previous ordinance which may conflict with the above are hereby repealed, effective with the effective date of this ordinance.

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 31 day of January 19 57 by and between THE SPERRY AND HUTCHINSON COMPANY, a corporation of the State of New Jersey with a principal place of business at 114 Fifth Avenue, New York, N. Y., hereinafter referred to as the "LICENSOR", and GODSEY Gulf Service doing a Gasoline Retail business at

Lanuel & Pine St., Foley Alabama No. and Street City or Town State

WHEREAS, the LICENSOR has devised, extensively advertised, popularized and successfully put into operation in many cities in various states of the Union a CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM whereby there may be offered to retail consumers a cash discount on all purchases, irrespective of their amount, thereby inviting and rewarding cash or prompt payment for goods sold for the purpose of decreasing the merchant's losses from slow or bad accounts and attracting and increasing the volume of his cash trade; and

WHEREAS, the LICENSOR desires to avail himself of the use of the LICENSORS' aforesaid CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM for said purposes:

FIRST: THE LICENSOR AGREES: (a) To license and authorize, and does hereby license and authorize, the Licensee to install and use in connection with his business at the aforesaid place and at the places listed on the reverse side hereof its said CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM and to use its CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS as cash discount symbols or tokens in connection therewith.

(b) To print the name and business address of the Licensee in any applicable directory of merchants, using its aforesaid CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM, hereafter issued and distributed by it. (c) To furnish to the Licensee advertising signs in quantities sufficient for use inside and outside his place or places of business to make known to the public that he has adopted its aforesaid CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM.

(d) To furnish the Licensee with its CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS to be issued to his customers as hereinafter provided. (e) To furnish for distribution CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS, in which customers may paste and accumulate CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS.

(f) To redeem the CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS, when collected in the manner herein prescribed and presented at any of its stores or redemption stations by the Licensee's customers, by giving them in exchange therefor, at the option of the Licensor or as required by law, cash or goods, wares or merchandise of their own selection, as described in its catalogues then current, and subject to the conditions herein and as printed in said catalogues and collectors' books.

SECOND: THE LICENSEE AGREES: (a) To adopt and use the Licensor's aforesaid CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM, during the term of this agreement at his place or places of business listed herein.

(b) To advertise the adoption and use of the Licensor's CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM and CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS in connection therewith by displaying in the windows or other prominent places in and about his place or places of business such advertising signs as shall be furnished by the Licensor from time to time, and also, in all newspaper and other advertisements published by or for him, to state the fact that he has adopted the aforesaid CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM and that he issues CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS.

(c) To order and receive from the Licensor CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS in lots of not less than five pads, and a minimum amount of not less than fifty pads every six months, each pad to contain five stamps. (d) To pay the Licensor for the use of its CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM an amount measured by the number of pads of stamps ordered and delivered at the rate of _____ dollars per pad payable on delivery of same.

(e) To offer CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS to all customers making cash payments, and when accepted to issue to the customers one of said stamps for each ten cents, represented in such payments, as a discount in consideration of the payment of cash when made either C.O.D. or, at the option of the Licensee, on or before the 20th proximo, and only for redemption by the Licensor.

(f) In consideration of the license to use the Licensor's CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM and the services to be performed by it and the initial and other expenses incurred in installing said system in the Licensee's place of business and in educating and making known to the public the advantages of the same, the Licensee agrees not to procure, use or dispose of the Licensor's CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS in any manner except as herein provided.

THIRD: THE PARTIES HERETO MUTUALLY AGREE: (a) The property in and title to CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT STAMPS and advertising signs shall remain in the Licensor and shall not in any event pass to the Licensee or any other person, firm or corporation. _____ years from _____ and shall thereafter renew itself for successive periods of equal duration until termination by either party giving to the other written notice of intention to terminate the agreement at the close of the then current period. Such notice shall be given at least thirty days prior to the close of such period and upon such notice being given the Licensor may thereafter omit from its printed directory and advertisements the name of the Licensee.

(b) Upon the termination of this agreement the Licensee shall cease to use any unused stamps then remaining in his hands and shall return to the Licensor all advertising signs and all of said stamps, measured by the number of stamps remaining unused and so returned, provided the same are unattached from the original pads, and the Licensee shall inform his customers that any stamps theretofore issued by him and then outstanding will be redeemed by the Licensor. The Licensee shall change his business in any material respect, use the Licensor's CO-OPERATIVE CASH DISCOUNT SYSTEM at any place of business as listed herein, or if the Licensee shall change his business in any material respect, or violate any of the provisions of this agreement by him to be performed, or if at any time during the term of this agreement proceeds in bankruptcy or shall be instituted by or against the Licensee, or if a receiver or trustee shall be appointed of the Licensee's property, or this agreement shall by operation of law devolve upon or pass to any person or persons other than said Licensee, then the Licensor may at its option terminate this agreement with respect to some or all of the Licensee's places of business, by written notice and upon the exercise of such option this agreement shall cease and determine; and no acquiescence by the Licensor in respect of any of the aforesaid matters shall operate as a waiver of its right to exercise such option. (e) This contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may not be altered, amended or added to, notwithstanding any part performance, unless such alteration, amendment or addition is signed by an officer of the Licensor at its address set forth above.
