That the Complainant owns, operates, conducts and manages a filling station business within the corporate limits of the City of Foley, Alabama, his business consisting of the sale of petroleum, petroleum products, tires, batteries, automobile accessories and related merchandise to the general public at retail prices, and the sale of services in the repair and maintenance of motor vehicles. That the Complainant's business is known as "Godsey's Gulf Service".

#### THIRD:

That on February 4, 1957, the City Council of the City

of Foley, Alabama, the Respondent herein, adopted "An Ordinance to define trading stamps; to regulate the act of marketing trading stamps; to levy a privilege license tax upon persons, firms, associations, partnerships and corporations marketing trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction; to make it unlawful to market trading stamps to or through merchants or vendors in the City of Foley, without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide penalties for such violation; to make it unlawful for any merchant or vendor in the City of Foley to give or market with the sale of merchandise or services, the trading stamps of any person, firm, association, partnership or corporation which has not first procured a license from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction, and to provide penalties for such violation, and to make it unlawful for merchants to use trading stamps to be given or sold with any merchandise or service without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide a penalty for such violation, and for other purposes.", which ordinance is hereinafter referred to as the trading stamp ordinance, a copy of which is attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, which trading stamp ordinance was approved by W. Max Griffin, as Mayor of the City of Foley, Alabama, on February 4, 1957, which copy is marked "Exhibit A".

#### FOURTH:

That on December 3, 1956, the City Council of the City of Foley, Alabama, the Respondent herein, adopted "An Ordinance to provide a schedule of License Fees for the City of Foley, Alabama; require the taking out of license before engaging in any business, trade, occupation, vocation, profession or exhibition; to provide for the issuance of such license; to provide a penalty for any violation of this ordinance, and for other purposes.", which ordinance is hereinafter referred to as the general license ordinance and schedule, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit B" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, which general license ordinance and schedule was approved by W. Max Griffin, as Mayor of the City of Foley, Alabama, on December 3, 1956. That

the Complainant has paid all of the license fees, and there has been issued to him all licenses, prescribed by said general license ordinance and schedule which are applicable to, and required of, the business operated by the Complainant aforesaid; and he has, in all respects, fully complied with all of the terms, provisions and requirements of said general license schedule and ordinance.

#### FIFTH:

That the Complainant did, in the course and conduct of his business aforesaid, on February 15, 1957, and he did, in the course and conduct of his business aforesaid, on each subsequent day thereafter up to and including the date on which this Bill of Complaint was filed, give or issue to the customers of his said business a trading stamp known as an "S&H Green Stamp" for each ten cents (104) paid in cash by each of his customers for the purchase of the products and services which he is now engaged in selling, and which he was on the dates hereinabove referred to engaged in selling. That the trading stamp or stamps given or issued by the Complainant aforesaid is and are substantially the same as the stamp which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit C" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein. A customer paying cash to the Complainant and receiving trading stamps from the Complainant as set forth above collects the stamps and pastes them in a book, substantially the same as the book which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit D" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, and when at least one book has been filled with said stamps (1200 stamps being required to fill one book) the customer may surrender the filled book to The Sperry And Hutchinson Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey and qualified to do business in the State of Alabama, for redemption in merchandise, or may surrender to said corporation, for redemption in merchandise, a filled book, or books, and fractions of books, as set forth in the catalogue of merchandise available to customers collecting said stamps, a copy of which catalogue is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit E" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein; all under and pur-

suant to a contract entered into by and between the Complainant and The Sperry And Hutchinson Company aforesaid, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit F" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein. The average retail value of the merchandise given in redemption of one book of stamps is Three Dollars (\$3.00), of two book Six Dollars (\$6.00), etc. There is no element of chance or deception in the system employed by the Complainant under the terms of the contract shown as "Exhibit F" and this system constitutes an effective system of sales promotion and advertising for the Complainant. All customers paying cash to the Complainant for the products and services which he is engaged in selling receive stamps on an equal and uniform basis and are able to definitely ascertain the value of the stamps by reference to the catalogue of The Sperry And Hutchinson Company, aforesaid.

## SIXTH:

That since the adoption and approval of the trading stamp ordinance and subsequent to the compliance by the Complainant with the terms and provisions of the general license ordinance and schedule the Complainant was, on February 15, 1957, and has been on each subsequent day thereafter, served by an officer, agent, servant or employee of the Respondent with a "Citation To Appear In Municipal Court" to answer to a charge of violating the trading stamp ordinance by giving or issuing trading stamps as therein defined without first having obtained a license as prescribed by said trading stamp ordinance under a complaint made by the Respondent herein. That on February 20, 1957, in answer to said citations, the Complainant appeared in the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, to answer the charges made against him on February 15th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th, respectively, by the Respondent; and he was on said date and in said Court tried by the Judge thereof and convicted of said alleged violation and fined Twenty-five and No/100 Dollars (\$25.00) for each of said alleged violations on each of said dates, or a total of One Hundred and Fifty and No/100 Dollars (\$150.00), plus the costs of Court. That on February 20, 1957, and immediately after the trial aforesaid and in open Court and before the same ad-

journed, the Complainant gave Notice of Appeal to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and the judge of said Municipal Court thereupon fixed an appeal bond in the penal sum of Three Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$300.00) conditioned on the appearance of the Complainant at the next term of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and from term to term thereof thereafter until discharged, and abide by and perform whatever sentence may be adjudged against the Complainant, in answer to the alleged violation of said trading stamp ordinance. That the Complainant at said time and place did execute said appeal bond which was then and there approved by the judge of said Court. That on February 27, 1957, in answer to citations served as aforesaid on the dates hereinafter set forth and requiring the Complainant to answer to a charge of violating the trading stamp ordinance by giving or issuing trading stamps as therein defined without first having obtained a license as prescribed in and by said trading stamp ordinance under a complaint made by the Respondent, the Complainant appeared in the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, to answer the charges made against him on February 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th and 27th, respectively, by the Respondent; and he was on said date and in said Court tried by the Judge thereof and convicted of said alleged violations and fined Twenty-five and No/100 Dollars (\$25.00) for each of said alleged violations on each of said dates, or a total of One Hundred and Seventy-five and No/100 Dollars (\$175.00), plus the costs of Court. That the Complainant did thereupon make and execute an appeal bond in the penal sum of Four Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$400. 00) conditioned as hereinabove set forth and which was approved by the judge of said Court all as hereinabove set forth, after first having given Notice of Appeal to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama. That since the 27th day of February, 1957, there has not been a session of the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Alabama, and the charges represented by the citations which have been served on the Complainant since said date are now pending in said Court and the Complainant has been commanded to appear therein on March 9, 1957, at 4:00, P. M., to answer said charges. That the Complainant has now appealed thirteen (13) separate cases to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, from the Municipal Court of the City of Foley, Ala-

bama, each involving the alleged violation by the Complainant of the trading stamp ordinance as aforesaid. That the continued enforcement of the trading stamp ordinance by the Respondent, acting by and through its officers, agents, servants or employees, will cause serious and irreparable injury and damage to the Complainant and he will thereby be deprived of the right to conduct his business in a lawful and legitimate manner and be deprived of valuable property rights. The presence of the officers, agents, servants or employees of the Respondent at the place of business of the Complainant for the purpose of serving the citations hereinabove referred to is, and has been, a matter of continuing embarrassment to the Complainant in the conduct of his said business and constitutes an unlawful and detrimental interference by the Respondent in the conduct and management of a lawful and legitimate business.

#### SEVENTH:

That the giving or issuance by the Complainant to his said customers of said trading stamps in the conduct and management of his said business does not affect the health, safety, welfare or morals of the citizens of the City of Foley, Alabama, and such manner of conducting and managing the business of the Complainant is not affected with a public interest.

#### EIGHTH:

That under the terms and provisions of the trading stamp ordinance merchants in the City of Foley, Alabama, may offer cash discounts to their customers without the use of trading stamps or they may advertise and promote their business by means other than the use of trading stamps and they are not required to obtain licenses or to pay a tax similar to that provided in the trading stamp ordinance.

#### NINTH:

The trading stamp ordinance is unconstitutional and is void and of no force and effect for the following reasons, separately and severally:

1. The ordinance is discriminatory in that it requires the Complainant and other merchants issuing or giving trading stamps to their customers to pay a tax on their gross receipts at a rate and in an amount therein prescribed and does not impose the same on other businesses in competition with the Complainant or the other merchants giving or issuing trading stamps.

2. The ordinance is discriminatory in that it does not impose a license tax upon retail merchants in the City of Foley, Alabama, who offer to the public their own trading stamps, coupons, tickets, certificates and similar advertising and promotional devices.

3. The enactment of the ordinance was beyond the authority of the City of Foley, Alabama.

4. It violates Article 1, Section 35, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama.

5. It violates the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America in that it denies the Complainant equal protection of the laws.

6. It violates Article 1, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama in that it deprives the Complainant of property and liberty without due process of law.

7. It violates the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America in that it deprives the Complainant of property and liberty without due process of law.

8. It is an attempt under the guise of a license tax to fix a penalty on the Complainant for conducting his business in a manner which is not detrimental to the health, welfare, safety or morals of the citizens of the City of Foley, Alabama.

9. It violates Article 1, Section 1, of the Constitution of the State of Alabama in that it is an attempt to impose a license on the method of conduct of a legitimate and lawful business.

10. It is an attempt under the guise of a revenue measure to exercise police power over a manner or method of conducting a legitimate business which manner or method does not offend public morals and does not work an injury to the public.

11. It is an unlawful exercise of the police power of the Respondent.

12. It deprives the Complainant of equal protection of the laws in that it discriminates between the Complainant and others in the City of Foley, Alabama, or its police jurisdiction, engaged in the same business as that of the Complainant, by imposing upon the Complainant an exceptional burden.

#### TENTH:

That the Complainant has no adequate remedy at law for the redress of the serious and irreparable injury and damage which he will suffer, and which he has suffered, through the continued enforcement by the Respondent of the trading stamp ordinance.

## PRAYER FOR PROCESS

The premises considered, the Complainant respectfully prays that the City of Foley, Alabama, a municipal corporation, be made a party Respondent to this Bill of Complaint and that the usual writ of process issue out of this Honorable Court requiring it to plead, answer or demur hereto within the time allowed by law and under the rules of this Honorable Court.

## PRAYER FOR RELIEF

The premises considered, the Complainant respectfully prays that upon the filing of this Bill of Complaint that this Honorable Court will grant to the Complainant a temporary injunction restraining and enjoining the Respondent, it officers, agents, servants and employees, and those acting in concert with it, from in any manner or by any means attempting to enforce the trading stamp ordinance, or initiating or prosecuting any proceeding against the Complainant for any alleged violation of said ordinance, pending this litigation. And the Complainant further prays that upon a final

hearing of this cause that this Honorable Court will enter an order and decree declaring the trading stamp ordinance unconstitutional and void and of no force and effect and will, in and by the terms of said order and decree, permanently enjoin and restrain the Respondent from enforcing, or attempting to enforce, said ordinance, or from initiating or prosecuting any proceeding against the Complainant to enforce the provisions thereof. And the Complainant prays for such other, further and different relief to which he may be entitled in the premises.

#### AN ORDINANCE

#### ORDINANCE NO. 101

An Ordinance to define trading stamps; to regulate the act of marketing trading stamps; to levy a privilege license tax upon persons, firms, associations, partnerships and corporations marketing trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction; to make it unlawful to market trading stamps to or through merchants or vendors in the City of Foley, without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide penalties for such violations; to make it unlawful for any merchant or vendor in the City of Foley to give or market with the sale of merchandise or services, the trading stamps of any person, firm, association, partnership or corporation which has not first procured a license from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction, and to provide penalties for such violation, and to make it unlawful for merchants to use trading stamps to be given or sold with any merchandise or service without first procuring a license from the City of Foley, and to provide a penalty for such violation, and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOLEY, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as Trading Stamps Ordinance No. 101 of the City of Foley, Alabama, of February 4, 1957.

Section II: It is not intended by this ordinance to repeal, abrogate, annul, or in any way impair or interfere with existing provisions of other laws or ordinances except those specifically repealed by this ordinance.

Section III: Definitions. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, and words shall have the meaning given herein. When not inconsistent with the contex, words used in the present tense included the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directive.

(a) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "trading stamps" shall also include and mean coupons, certificates, and other similar devices which are redeemable or to be used for anything of value.

(b) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "Person" shall include firm, association, partnership and corporation.

(c) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "Marketing" shall also include and mean selling for cash or anything of value.

(d) For the purpose of this ordinance the term "merchants" shall include persons, firms and corporations who sell services or property, both real and personal.

Section IV: For the purpose of this ordinance trading stamps are and shall be presumed to have been marketed to the merchant by the person responsible for their redemption when the merchant gives or markets the trading stamps of such person in connection with the sale of property (both real and personal) or services by the merchant.

Section V: Every person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants within the city limits of Foley shall pay to the City of Foley the annual license of \$2,500.00, and shall pay in addition thereto a sum equal to that paid by every merchant, firm, or corporation to whom these stamps are marketed, as set out in Section X hereof, for the privilege of engaging in such business within the municipality, which license shall be due and payable at the time such person engages in such business, or on January lst of each calendar year, whichever occurs first, and such person shall have first qualified to engage in such business as hereinafter provided.

Section VI: Every person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, But not in the city limits of the City of Foley, shall pay an annual license fee of \$1,250.00 and shall pay in addition thereto a sum equal to that paid by every merchant, firm or corporation to whom these stamps are marketed as set out in Section X hereof, for the privilege of engaging in such business within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, which licenses shall be due and payable at the time such person engages in such business, or on January 1st of each calendar year, whichever occurs first.

Section VII: Before engaging in the business of marketing trading stamps within the city limits or police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, every person shall make application for license from the City of Foley through its clerk who shall require the applicant to supply certified statement of the last audit report of the company responsible for redeeming the trading stamps sought to be marketed. The clerk shall not issue a license to persons for the privilege of marketing trading stamps until he has received the foregoing statement and submitted it to the city council for its approval and authorization. The city council may require such other statements and affidavits from the applicant as it might deem necessary for the protection of the public, before authorizing the issuance of such license.

Section VIII: The agents or representatives of persons who engage in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants in this city shall be personally responsible for the compliance of their principals and of the business they represent with this ordinance.

Section IX: It shall be unlawful for any person who engages in the business of marketing trading stamps to merchants in the City of Foley without first having procured a license as provided for herein and each day in which said business is so engaged shall constitute a separate offense.

Section X: Each merchant who gives or markets in any manner the trading stamps shall be required in addition to all other licenses, to pay to the city on each separate place of business in which any part or phase of the business of issuing, selling, giving or other distributing of such trading stamps occurs, an annual license as follows: where the gross receipts from any such place of business for the year next preceding was:

As used in this Section, the term "gross receipts" shall mean the entire receipts from the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services without regard to the issuance of trading stamps, and as a part of the application for license, a statement under oath must be submitted to the city clerk showing the gross receipts and shall be executed by the owner, if an individual enterprise, by a partner, if a partnership, or by the President, if a corporation.

Section XI: The annual license for a merchant within the police jurisdiction of the City of Foley, but not in the city limits of the City of Foley, will be one-half of the amount as shown in Section X above, and all other requirements thereof must be met.

Section XII: It shall be unlawful for any merchant as hereinabove defined who does business in the City of Foley or its police jurisdiction to give or market with the sale of merchandise the trading stamps of any person who has not first procured the license herein required from the City of Foley to market said trading stamps in the city or its police jurisdiction, and each day in which said merchant violates the foregoing provision shall constitute a separate offense.

Section XIII: The license imposed by this ordinance shall not apply to persons issuing coupons or certificates furnished by a manufacturer or compounded as a part of an original package or item of merchandise and distributed in connection with that one commodity only.

Section XIV: Any Section of this ordinance which may hereinafter be held invalid or unconstitutional, shall in no way affect or impair the validity and enforceability of any other Section hereof.

Section XV: And any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined not more than \$100.00 to which may be added, in the discretion of the Judge of the Court trying the case, confinement to jail and to hard labor for the city, for a period not to exceed six months, and each day of violation shall be considered as a separate offense.
