


CONDEMNOR'S CHARGE # 1

You are instructed that the opinions of witnesses as to the market value of property should be weighed by the jury in the light of other evidence, and the opportunity of the witnesses to know such value, and the reasonableness or unreasonableness of their estimate of such value. The jury are not bound to take any man's opinion of such value, but may act on their own judgment and good sense in arriving at a just value, in the light of the whole evidence.



CONDEMNOR'S CHARGE # 2

The Court charges the jury that, if they find for the Condemnor in this case, the measure of their damages is the difference between the fair market value of the land described in the complaint just before the 19th day of January, 1977, and its value on the 19th day of January, 1977, the date of its taking.
