Dean Miss Duck:

I had intended to return to alabama to answer the Bill of Complaint in person which was filed against me by my husband, Itanden It. Crabb but I can not afford the money I trip back there would cost. Itowhere, I want you to know the whole thing is nothing but lies.

I did not abandon mr. Crabb nor have I refused to return to him. neither has it been a year since we parted in mobile as I left there on August 24, 1952. It is the one who made the reservation on the plane for me to come out here, bought my ticket and drove me to the aur port at Bates Field. I didn't wish to come out here at that time as I had expected to go to Florida with him where he was working. Out reighbors in mobile knew that was my intention when we sold our home to the m = Wonalds but Mr. Crabb insisted I should come out here at that time. I thought it was to be for a visit only until I received a letter from him november 1, 1952. This is part of that letter _ "Theta the rest of this

letter is going to be hard for me to write. Itad I held my job at Sulf I believe I we would have made out O.K. It least we would have had a house and some money. I tried it with the truck but the longer I Lept It up the harder it became for me to return to mobile. I just seemed to be all thisted up all the time and yet I knew it was not right that you be alone all the time but 3 could not get enough money ahead to do any different. That man in S.F. was on my mind too mudt of the time. I guess I let it become an obsession with me. Finally I decided to sell the house, give you the money and ask you to turn me free and then do something to even the score with him if I could win in no other way. I know now I can trever get straightened out and that is definite. If I stall here as Sure as I am aline right now Twice get into trouble. Consequently I intend to go foreign. I have made a good contact and I will at least be able to pay off my debts and who knows? maybe get another start. although 5 don't really care too much and just seem to be tired and have been for a long time. It has not been four to you but what could I do? The first chance that came up I at least got you back amongst friends where you would not be blone. I did think for awhile that I would like to transfer out to S. F. but that would be about the worst thing I could do. On top of that you know I do not like it out there and never bould. However I may make out O.K. yet, but I want to be free and on my own with no Responsibilities whatsoever. Will you dit? I have never intended to hurt you or make you undappy but every time I got a start Something would show up and I had to start in again. It gets tiresome in time and I am no younger

and as it stands right now I don't care too much anyway. I believe Dwill be able to sell the Tractor and let the money go on the notes until it is paid for and still have a little left over. Will know more after I talk to give in Birmingham. I can trust him and that is a help. I intend for you to have all the house brings in , including the money I have received so far. If you do not want to take my word Seo. Tonsmine can hadle it for you. That is the best I can do. I wish you would white me at 256 Siena Vista and I will beceive it when I go there from Birmingham next week. Should also be able to send you some money next week as I will get some frosh fim. I gress that is all for now take it easy and let me hear from you. always. Hayden. I heard nothing more from him until I received a night letter November 18, 1952 as follows: -Blease comply with request in Jonsmeine letter immediately. Viel with full details from Trimidal in about one week. Hayden: I never received that letter and doubt that he ever unote it. nothing had been mentioned about a divonce until I received the letter from mr. I onsmeine saying mr. Crabb had been in to see him that day (nov. 13, 1952) and made arrangements for him to handle the closing of the sale of bur home to Mr. Mc blonded for a total sale pride of #14, 500 to. also that mr. Crabb had advised him that we had agreed on a divorce and that he wished him to secure it there in mobile. I have never agreed to a divorce. I heard nothling more from Mr. Crabb until January, 15, 1953. In that letter he wrote _" Theta if I did not have to be free I would not have asked you for

a divorce but it is absolutely necessary. To fight it will only cause both of us a lot of worm, trouble and money. I told you in the letter (the one) I didn't seceive) I was in plenty trouble and unless you would consent to divorce it could and would be worse and that is still the way it stands."

When Mr. Crabb built our house in mobile he borround 2800 % from my daughter and myself which

was money from my nother's estate. Deso most of the 21000 in bonds we cashed to buy the lot belonged tome. He gave me the 7000 we had in bonds i 1943 when we separated for a short time as he thought he was in love with a young girl. Then I sould 1000 tim bonds out of my allowance he sent me while at sea. So far from the sale of our home in mobile I have received 3538.80 (and 14000 of that belongs to my daughter) and 25000 mr. Crabb gave me just before he put me on the plane to coshe out like. We also had several thousand dollars tied up in a tractor, trailer, Packard car and furniture! I believe mr. Crabb should pay me the money he has promised (the money he drew against the house the first two months I was out here) before he is given a divorce, marries again and takes on more responsibilities. I tried to explain all this to Mr. I onsmeine and was surprised when he filed the Bill of Complaint before it was straightened out. Mr. Crabb owes me 4750 %. all I have received from him so far is

I wish I could offord to come back there and appear in person. I fell Mr. Crabb has treated me

in a shabby manner. & vidently he just decided to discard me for someone younger. I am 52. My daughter is a widow with three small children to support. I fer husband was killed in an automobile accident two years ago. Mr. Crabb is the one who abandoned me. I sent me out here instead of letting me go to Florida with him as I wanted to do. Ite promised to send me some money but he never did. If he had any intentions of beeping his promise he certainly could have sent me something during the past five months.

When Mr. Crabb and I were heavied on fam. 25,1940

When Mr. Crabb and I were huavied on fam. 25, 1940 he had nothing except a job and a lot of debta. In less than a week after our marriage he lost his job due to union trouble and he didn't get another job until seven months later. We spent a good part of that time seven months later. We spent a good part of that time here in Hilman with my folks. I deprived myself of many things so we could accumulate what little we had. He only bought me two coats during the nearly 13 years we were together and I am still wearing the last one he bought for me in 1945.

I trust and pray the court will not grant a divorce to m. Craft. I did not voluntarily abandon his bed and board without his consect nor have I refused to return to him.
