Dollars for the support and care of said child and that said amount may be paid  
in semi-monthly sums of Ten (10) Dollars, each, on the 2nd and 17th of each month

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry  
except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken  
within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said  
appeal.

It is further ordered that Complainant and Respondent  
be, and are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of  
this suit.

It is further ordered that Livingstone B. Claybrone  
the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

doth depose and say as follows:

I am 24 years old and Angella, my wife, is 22. We were married June 17th 1951 at Lucedale, Mississippi. At the time of our marriage, I had a place for us to live in Baldwin County where both of us were born and have lived since our birth. After we were married, Angella refused to come to live with me. In fact, we lived as husband and wife only during our honeymoon. She went to live with her people and has never shown any desire to make a home with me in spite of any requests made of her by me which were numerous. I believe that she was pregnant when we were married. However, since I do not know for sure, I want to do what may be right toward supporting the baby, Glorie Jean, who is about to be 16 months old. Also, I am willing for her to have custody and control of the baby. I do not make very much but I am prepared to pay \$20 per month for the baby. Angella works and makes as much as I do. She works for some white people in Fairhope. We both live in Fairhope, Baldwin County, Alabama.

And the said Georgia McConico doth depose and say as follows:

Livingstone is my husband's nephew. I know that they were married during the middle of 1951. I know, also, that Angella never did live with Livingstone when they came back after they were married. I know that both Livingstone and Angella were born in Baldwin County, Alabama, and that they have both lived in Baldwin County ever since. I know that Livingstone has been paying as much as his earnings and other obligations permit toward the baby's care. I can say positively that they never lived together from July 1st 1951 to the present and Angella has said that she would not live with Livingstone. I do not understand all about the situation but I do feel that Angella treated Livingstone very badly. He is a good boy and has a good reputation. I think that she made a "sucker" of him as the saying goes.

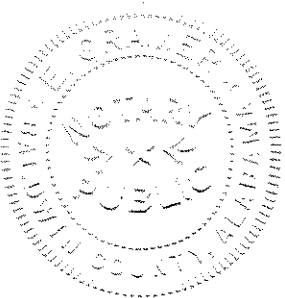

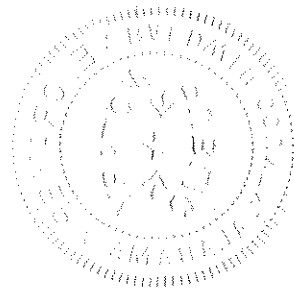
