It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

Comes Your Complainant, Mildred D. Passage, and exhibits this, Her Bill of Complaint against Charles D. Passage, and says as follows:

1. Complainant and Respondent intermarried on September 18th 1917 at Brookline, Massachusetts.
2. Complainant is past the age of 21 years and Respondent is 59 years of age.
3. Complainant has lived in Fairhope, Baldwin County, Alabama, for more than eight (8) years.
4. In August of 1938, Respondent Voluntarily Abandoned Complainant and has continued said abandonment, with total neglect of the marital covenant on his part, ever since that date.

The premises considered, Complainant prays that all legal and appropriate process issue out of Your Honorable Court, requiring that Respondent appear personally before your said Court and make answer to the several paragraphs of this Bill of Complaint and that he be required to abide all decrees and orders that to Your Honor may seem meet and proper.

Complainant further prays, upon a hearing of this cause, that a decree be rendered forever divorcing her from said Respondent and granting such other, further and different relief and may appear proper in the premises.

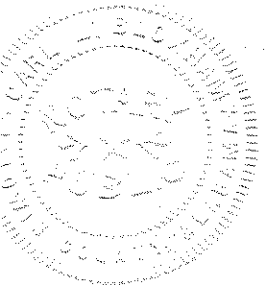


