1. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, by force or threats of violence to person or property, did prevent Ray E. Loper Lumber Company, Inc., an Alabama Corporation, from furnishing materials to other persons or firms engaged in lawful business, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
2. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did disturb, interfere with or prevent the peaceable exercise of the lawful business of Ray E. Loper Lumber Company, Inc., an Alabama Corporation, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
3. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did disturb, interfere with or attempt to prevent the peaceable exercise of the lawful business of Ray E. Loper Lumber Company, Inc., an Alabama Corporation, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
4. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did disturb, interfere with or attempt to prevent the peaceable exercise of J. F. Barnes of his lawful business or calling, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
5. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did, by force or threats of violence to person or property, seek to prevent J. F. Barnes from doing work, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
6. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did, without just cause or legal excuse for so doing, enter into a combination, conspiracy, agreement, arrangement or understanding for the purpose of hindering, delaying or preventing Ray E. Loper Lumber Company, Inc., an Alabama Corporation, from carrying on a lawful business, to-wit, the business of operating a sawmill and planer mill, against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
7. The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this indictment Joseph K. Koeval, C. W. McColeman and W. G. Parker, whose names are to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, did disturb, interfere with or prevent the peaceable exercise of the lawful business of Ray E. Loper Lumber Company, Inc., an Alabama Corporation, to-wit, the business of operating a sawmill and planer mill,

against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
