Deposition of H.L.Stanton, witness examined on behalf of complainant in the above entitled cause, taken before T.W. Richerson, the commissioner named in attached commission, at the time, place, and in the manner hereinafter stated.

DEPOSITION OF H.L.STANTON.

My name is H.L.Stanton. I am a son of Nettie Stanton and E.E.Stanton, deceased, and am 25 years of age. The complainant in this case is the wife of E.E.Stanton, who owned the Northeast quarter of Section 29, Township 4 South, Range 2 East, at the time of his death. It was his homestead. The property has been set aside as the homestead of the complainant, and at this time it belongs to her absolutely. She is in possession of it, and she and my father have had possession of it for more than twenty years, and have lived on it during all of that time.

2. I have personal knowledge of the facts concerning the said land up to the time of my father's death, he lived on it with the complainant in this case, who was his wife. They have had actual possession of the land, occupied it as their home, and no one else ever disputed their right to possession or claim to possession that I ever heard of since it was purchased, and no suit is pending to test complainant's title to or possession of the land. She has color of title to the land in this way: My father bought it and got a deed to it from Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and it described the land, but the deed has been lost. The complainant and those through whom she claims have paid taxes on the land for twenty years or more, and have assessed the land for taxes during that time, and no one else has paid taxes on it or assessed it. E.E.Stanton, my father, is dead. He died intestate a number of years ago. During his life he purchased the land from Henry

A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz and paid them cash, and they gave him a deed, but the deed was lost before it was placed on record. Up to the time Jacobowitz gave the deed and delivered possession of the land to my father, he claimed title and possession under the following chain of title: Patent from the United States to Elijah L. Wilson, dated January 18th., 1892, and recorded in Deed Book "Z", pages 158-9; warranty deed from Elijah L. Wilson to Zelpha B. Wilson, dated August 6th., 1888, and recorded in Deed Book "P", page 123; mortgage from S.A. Ward and N.B. Ward to Elijah L. Wilson, dated August 17th., 1895, and recorded in Mortgage Book "I", pages 370-2; foreclosure deed of the foregoing mortgage, to Zelpha B. Wilson, dated June 29th., 1896, and recorded in Deed Book "W", pages 435-6; Deed from Zelpha B. Wilson and Elijah L. Wilson to Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, dated May 23rd., 1899, and recorded in Deed Book "W", pages 224-5. All of said deeds were recorded on the Baldwin County Records. Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz made a deed to E.E. Stanton, my father, but the deed was lost before it was recorded. The record title therefore stands on the Records of Baldwin County in the name of Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, because their deed to my father was lost, but the deed was made and delivered to my father, and the purchase money was paid to Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz.

3.- During the whole time the complainant and those through whom she claims have owned this land, they have regularly assessed and paid the taxes, and it now stands on the records of Baldwin County as assessed to complainant in the name of "Estate of E.E. Stanton".

4.- There is no record title to S.A. Ward and N.B. Ward, and no one of that name claims the land now, but they at one time mortgaged the land as recorded, but the mortgage was foreclosed and bought in by Zelpha B. Wilson.

5.- I don't know where either Henry A. Jacobowitz or Emma Jacobowitz live, they do not live in Alabama, and I don't know their addresses. I have made diligent effort to ascertain the same, and to ascertain the names of their heirs, next of

kin or devisees, if any. The estate of E.E.Stanton has had abstracts made of the public records of Baldwin County, and have inquired of all available persons who were supposed to know or have information concerning them, and nothing about them can be ascertained. No one could be found who knew or had any information concerning same, except that they at one time lived in Baldwin County and left that county with the intention of going back to their former home in a foreign State. That was over twenty years ago. They came to Alabama from a foreign State, and lived in Baldwin County for a short time, and during that time sold the land to my father. When they left Baldwin County they went to Mobile and resided there temporarily, but with the intent of leaving Alabama permanently; they haven't been heard of definitely in so far as I can find, but I have heard that they lost their lives in the storm of 1916. I don't know and can't find, by the exercise of reasonable diligence, where they came from when they came to Alabama. In order to permanently establish complainant's title and to quiet same, this bill was filed.

6.- I am intimately acquainted with the affairs of E.E.Stanton, and also with his wife, the complainant, in this case. I know where they kept their papers, and have haven't any of the original deeds making up this claim of title. The deed to E.E.Stanton was, as stated, lost before it was recorded, and if he ever had any of the other deeds referred to, they have been lost.

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN D. LEIGH, JUDGE:

Humbly complaining, your Oratrix, Margarett J. Stanton, brings this bill of complaint against that certain land in Baldwin County, Alabama, described as the Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-nine, Township Four South, Range Two East, and against Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and against the unknown heirs, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees of Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and against any and all persons, firms or corporations claiming any title to, interest in, lien or incumbrance on said land or any part thereof, and your Oratrix respectfully shows:

1st.- Oratrix is over the age of twenty-one years, and is a bona fide resident of Daphne, Baldwin County, Alabama, and Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, if living, are over the age of twenty-one years, and are non-residents of Alabama.

2nd.- Oratrix is in actual, peaceable possession of the Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-nine, Township Four South, Range Two East, claims to own the same absolutely and in fee simple, and no suit is pending to test her title to, or interest in, possession or right to said land. Your Oratrix and those through whom she claims title hold and have held color of title to said land, assessed and paid taxes on same for more than twenty years continuously next preceding the filing of this bill of complaint, and no other person, persons, firms or corporations have, during said period of time, assessed or paid taxes on the said land, or had possession thereof, or, so far as your Oratrix knows, asserted any claim to or right to said land.

3rd.- Your Oratrix is the widow of Eli E. Stanton, who died intestate a number of years ago; before his death he acquired a deed for said land from the respondents, Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and paid a valuable consideration for same, but the deed was lost before being recorded. Following the making and delivery of said deed, and up to the time of his death, the said

Eli E. Stanton and your Oratrix, his wife, occupied the said land as their homestead, and since the death of her husband, petitioner *It does not exceed 160 acres in value or \$2000 in value.* has occupied the said premises as a homestead. The said Eli E.

Stanton left no minor children, and left no other property than the land herein described, which has been claimed by petitioner as her homestead, And Oratrix further shows that the record title of said land stands on the public records in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Baldwin County, Alabama, in the following names, and as follows: Patent from United States to Eli L. Wilson, dated January 18th., 1892, recorded in Deed Book "Z", page 158; deed from Eli L. Wilson to Zelpha B. Wilson, dated August 6th., 1888, recorded in Deed Book "P", page 123; Deed from Zelpha B. Wilson and Eli L. Wilson to Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, dated May 23rd., 1899, and recorded in Deed Book "W", page 224. And Oratrix shows that while the land stands on the records in the Office of the Probate Judge of Baldwin County, Alabama, as herein stated, it is assessed to petitioner, who claims the same absolutely as her homestead, as the widow of the said Eli E. Stanton, who purchased the same from Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, as hereinabove stated. The estate of the said Eli E. Stanton has never been administered.

4th.- Your Oratrix further shows that she does not know whether the said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz are alive or dead, nor whether, if dead, they left any heirs, next of kin, personal representatives or devisees, and does not know the names or addresses of any of said heirs, next of kin, personal representatives or devisees. Your Oratrix has made diligent search to ascertain the address of the said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and has made diligent search to ascertain if they or either of them be dead, and if dead, the names and addresses of their heirs, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees; that in the prosecution of such efforts, your Oratrix has had abstracts made, the public records of Baldwin County examined, inquired of all persons who were supposed to know or might have information concerning such matters, and has caused inquiry to be made of people living in the vicinity of the land described, and no one could be

found who knew or had any information as to whether any of the said defendants are living or dead, or as to whether they left any heirs, next of kin, personal representatives or devisees. The only information Oratrix has been able to secure is that said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz came to Alabama from somewhere in the State of Minnesota, but this information is very indefinite and the postoffice address or the former postoffice address in such State cannot be ascertained. Your Oratrix is informed and believes, and upon such information and belief states, that the said defendants are non-residents of the State of Alabama; if living, they live somewhere in the State of Minnesota; if dead, their heirs, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees, if any, live somewhere in that State, but their postoffice addresses are unknown. Your Oratrix further shows that the said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, just after the purchase of said land by the said Eli E. Stanton, moved from Baldwin County, and temporarily resided in Mobile County, but with the intention of leaving Alabama permanently and going back to Minnesota. They left Mobile County and were last heard from just before the storm of 1916, and it has been reported that they, and Oratrix believes that they lost their lives in that storm. This information comes to Oratrix through persons who knew the said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz while they were temporarily residing in Mobile.

5th.- Your Oratrix brings this bill of complaint against the land hereinabove described, and against the said Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, and if they be dead, against their heirs at law, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees, and against any and all other persons, firms or corporations claiming any part of said land, any interest therein, or any lien or incumbrance thereon, for the purpose of establishing Oratrix' claim to and interest in said land, and clearing up all doubts and disputes concerning same.


PRAYER FOR PROCESS:

The premises considered, your Oratrix prays that the land hereinabove described, and defendants herein named, and the unknown heirs, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees of each of the said defendants, and all persons, firms or corporations

claiming any title to, interest in, or lien or incumbrance on said land or any part thereof, be made parties defendant to this bill of complaint, and be brought into this court by publication or other usual and proper process, and be required to appear, plead, answer or demur to this bill of complaint within the time prescribed by law, and under the rules of this Honorable Court; that notice of the pendency of this bill of complaint be published and a certified copy thereof properly certified be filed in the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and that such other notice of the pendency of the bill of complaint be given as may be required by law or the rules of this Honorable Court.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF:

Oratrix further prays that if any of the defendants specifically named, or if they be dead, their heirs at law, next of kin, personal representatives and devisees, or any person, firm or corporation claims said land, or any part thereof, or any interest therein, or lien or incumbrance thereon, he or they be required to set forth and specify such claim, title, interest, lien, or incumbrance, and set forth how, and by what instrument the same is derived or created. Oratrix further prays that upon the final hearing of this cause, it be ordered, adjudged and decreed that Oratrix, at the time of the filing of this bill of complaint, and when decree is rendered, has the legal title to the said land, and that none of the defendants, or any other person, persons, firm or corporation have or own the same or any part thereof, or have any right, title or interest therein or thereto, or any lien or incumbrance thereon, and Oratrix prays for such other, further, different and general relief as in equity and good conscience she may be entitled to receive, in the premises.

It is now therefore hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that the complainant have judgment as prayed for in her bill of complaint herein, against the land described in the bill of complaint, and the defendants and each of them; that all claims of the defendants, Henry A. Jacobowitz and Emma Jacobowitz, if they be living, and if dead, all claims of their heirs, personal representatives, next of kin, and devisees, and each of them, in and to the lands described in the bill of complaint, and all claims of all persons, firms or corporations other than complainants, claiming the said land, or any part thereof, or any interest therein, or lien or incumbrance thereon, are hereby adjudged and decreed to be invalid and groundless. 
