26 April 1951

At about 4:45 PM Wednesday April 25, 1951, I was proceeding along US highway 90 from Mobile to Pensacola. A car pulled into the highway from Marie's Cafe, and started toward Pensacola. I pulled up behind and started to pass when I noticed the car weaving from side to side, and the woman next to the driver waving her arms. I dropped back about a hundred feet behind the car, which I had noticed was a dark '47 or '48 Kaiser with Texas registration. The car ran off the road to the right two or three times, narrowly missing a guard rail and highway marker sign, barely missed a trailer truck, and ran two automobiles proceeding in the opposite direction off on the shoulder of the road. Approximately 1.6 miles from the place the car got in front of me, we came to a slight curve to the right. The Kaiser proceeded straight, crossed the center line and struck the left front of a Ford proceeding toward Mobile. The Ford made every effort to miss the Kaiser, and was completely off the road on the shoulder when hit. The impact knocked the Kaiser back in the center of the road and it did not stop. The Ford was turned around and over, landing in its right side. One of the passengers in the Ford and I turned the car back on its wheels to get it off two of the passengers who were pinned underneath. The Kaiser was stopped approximately one mile from the accident.

Statement by time about 4-30 P. M. ~~is~~ 4/25/51

Bernard Finney, I saw the car driven by Leslie Mitchell pulling over to the right, of the road, then he swung over to my side, and I pulled toward the ditch on my side and as my car left the pavement with the right wheels on the dirt Mitchell's car sideswiped my car and turned my car over. Mitchell did not stop, there were in my car ~~with~~ J. L. Parker, Alice Parker, Maxine Parker, James Parker, Barbara Parker, Ann Parker, Comer Lox Parker, and Blanche Finney, and Diane Braeswell.

J. L. Parker, and Blanche Finney were Hospitalized, Helen Parker injured, Maxine Parker also injured, others bruised.

Accident occurred about 4-30, P. M. 11.1 Miles from Robertsdale, Ala. on U. S. Highway 90 east of Robertsdale, Ala. Baldwin County, April, 25th 1951.

Parker, Sr., or Helen Parker to a physician or hospital for medical treatment, it appearing that such treatment was necessary, all contrary to law and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
