February 13, 1917. At the time of our marriage we resided
Luverne, in Crenshaw County, Alabama, and since that time we
have resided in different places in said State. On to-wit:
August 15, 1926, while we resided at Luverne, Alabama, in said
Crenshaw County; the defendant, L. A. Petty, voluntarily, and

...without any fault on my part, abandoned me, the complainant in...
this cause, and without any lawful cause or good excuse on his...
part therefor, and that ever since said abandonment, he, the said
L. A. Petty, has failed and refused to live with me. I have three
children as the result of this marriage with the defendant, to-wit:
Opal Petty, aged ten years; Hubert Petty, aged eight years; and
Hobart Petty, aged five years, all of whom now live with me in...
Bay Minette, and whom I have to support... For the past sixteen...
months L. A. Petty, my husband, has not contributed anything to...
the support of these children or myself... I am now supporting them
and expect to do so in the future.

G. W. Petty, a witness for the defendant, who being duly
sworn, testifies as follows: My name is G. W. Petty, and I reside
at Bay Minette, Alabama. I know Cora Petty and L. A. Petty, and
knew them about the time the separation occurred between them as
man and wife. They were residing in Crenshaw County. I was up...
there on a visit at the time, and know that L. A. Petty abandoned
Cora Petty. It was about July or August three years ago this...
coming summer, which was in the year 1926. He voluntarily left...
her. I was there when he left her, and he came off with me and...
went to his father's house, and he continued to reside at his
father's house as long as I was there, and did not go back to live
with Cora Petty. And this was without any fault on the part of
Cora Petty that I know of. He had no lawful cause or good excuse
for doing this that I know of. I have known Cora Petty and L. A.
Petty about three years. I do not know where L. A. Petty resides
now, but Cora Petty resides in Bay Minette, Alabama. She has been
a bona fide resident citizen of the State of Alabama for the
last three years.

William R. Gregory, a witness for the Complainant, who
being duly sworn, testifies as follows: I reside now in Bay
Minette, and formerly lived in Crenshaw County, Alabama, and
lived there when the said Cora Petty and L. A. Petty were
married, to-wit: February 13, 1917. They are both over 21

years of age. L. A. Petty lived about three miles from me when he married the said Cora Petty, who was formerly Cora Styron. I do not know where L. A. Petty is residing now, but Cora is living at Bay Minette, Baldwin County, Alabama. She has been residing at Bay Minette for two years, and has been a bona fide resident of the State of Alabama for the past three years and more, before the filing of the Bill of Complaint in this cause. In the year 1926 I went up into Crenshaw County, about July 3rd, and stayed there until the 9th of September. While there I knew these parties, Cora Petty and L. A. Petty, and they separated while I was there. L. A. Petty abandoned Cora Petty. Since said abandonment he has never returned to live with her as husband and wife. I have lived within a mile and a half ^{of her} for the past two years. I have ~~xx~~ visited her place and she has visited mine, and I know that L. A. Petty has not lived with her as man and wife for the past three years, since he abandoned her in Crenshaw County, August 15, 1926. He abandoned her voluntarily and without any fault on her part, and he had no lawful cause or good excuse for doing so. Since said abandonment of Cora Petty by L. A. Petty, the said L. A. Petty has failed and refused to live with her.





Third. (That your Oratrix) has been a bona fide resident citizen of the state of Alabama for three years and more next preceding the filing of the Bill of Complaint in this cause and is over the age of twenty one years.

Fourth. That the said L. A. Petty, the defendant aforesaid, has remained away from your Oratrix at all times subsequent to his said abandonment of your Oratrix, on towit, August 15th, 1926 and that your Oratrix and the said L. A. Petty have not cohabitated as man and wife since August, 15th, 1926.


