The opinion of some individuals contacted was that subject should be given a chance on probation to rehabilitate himself; others felt that he would revert to former habits and manner of behavior.
- 7. Probation Program: In the event the court sees fit to grant the defendant probation he would reside in the home of his cousin, Norman Harwell, Bay Minette, Alabama who would assist him in obtaining employment.

REMARKS: From the course of this investigation this writer must come to the conclusion that subject has been without the benefit of proper parental and Christian influences needed as an incentive to guide him in his formative years. This officer has always been of the opinion that it is better to treat the young offender with the proper probation program than to incarcerate him in an institution where he would acquire the traits of a more hardened criminal. The court should impress upon this individual the necessity of adhering strictly to rules and regulations as set forth by the court and also to advice and counsel given by this office, in the event the court should see fit to place the subject on probation.

The opinion of some individuals contacted was that subject should be given a chance on probation to rehabilitate himself; others felt that he would revert to former habits and manner of behavior.
- 7. Probation Program: In the event the court sees fit to grant the defendant probation he would reside in the home of his cousin, Norman Harwell, Bay Minette, Alabama who would assist him in obtaining employment.

REMARKS: From the course of this investigation this writer must come to the conclusion that subject has been without the benefit of proper parental and Christian influences needed as an incentive to guide him in his formative years. This officer has always been of the opinion that it is better to treat the young offender with the proper probation program than to incarcerate him in an institution where he would acquire the traits of a more hardened criminal. The court should impress upon this individual the necessity of adhering strictly to rules and regulations as set forth by the court and also to advice and counsel given by this office, in the event the court should see fit to place the subject on probation.
