



6. The Court charges the jury that if you believe from the evidence that the death of Agnes Pavlista was the result of an unavoidable accident, then you should find the Defendant not guilty.



10. I charge you, gentlemen of the jury, that if each of you are reasonably satisfied from the evidence that the Defendant stopped her automobile before driving it on the paved highway, then she did not engage in the commission of an unlawful act by driving on the paved highway, even though the death of Agnes Pavlista accidentally occurred as a proximate consequence thereof.




9. I charge you, gentlemen of the jury, that before you can convict the Defendant of Manslaughter in the second degree, as charged in the indictment, each of you must believe from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt and to a moral certainty that the death of Agnes Pavlista was the promimate result of the commission of an unlawful act by the Defendant.

7. The Court charges the jury that if you believe from the evidence that Agnes Pavlista was accidentally and unintentionally killed by the Defendant and that her death was not proximately caused by the commission of an unlawful act, then you should find the Defendant not guilty.

5. The Court charges the jury that if you believe from the evidence that the death of Agnes Pavlista was the result of an accident, then you should find the Defendant not guilty.

4. I charge you, gentlemen of the jury, that before you can convict the Defendant of Manslaughter in the second degree, as charged in the indictment, each of you must be convinced from the evidence beyond all reasonable doubt and to a moral certainty that the Defendant was engaged in the commission of an unlawful act at the time Agnes Pavlista was killed and that the death of Agnes Pavlista was proximately caused by the Defendant, while committing such unlawful act.



3. The Court charges the jury that before you can convict the Defendant of Manslaughter in the second degree, as charged in the indictment, you must first believe from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt and to a moral certainty that the death of Agnes Pavlista was proximately caused by the Defendant, while engaged in the commission of an unlawful act.

1. The Court charges the jury that if you believe the evidence in this case, you should acquit the Defendant.

8. The Court charges the jury that before you can convict the Defendant of Manslaughter in the second degree, as charged in the indictment, you must first believe from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt and to a moral certainty that the Defendant was engaged in the commission of an unlawful act at the time Agnes Pavlista was killed and, second, that the death of Agnes Pavlista was proximately caused by the Defendant, while engaged in the commission of an unlawful act.

Now comes the Defendant and demurs to the Indictment filed in this cause and as grounds of such Demurrer sets down and assigns separately and severally the following:

- 1. It states no offense known to the law.
- 2. It does not allege that the Defendant was engaged in the commission of an unlawful act at the time the deceased was killed.
- 3. No facts are alleged to show that the Defendant was engaged in the commission of an unlawful act at the time Agnes Pavlista was killed and that the death of Agnes Pavlista was proximately caused by the commission of such unlawful act.
- 4. No facts are alleged to show that the death of Agnes Pavlista was proximately caused by the commission of an unlawful act by the Defendant.
- 5. The words "by negligently driving an automobile into, upon or against the automobile in which said Agnes Pavlista was riding" do not show that the Defendant was engaged in the commission of an unlawful act at the time the deceased was killed.
- 6. No facts are alleged to show how the deceased was killed.
- 7. The Indictment does not inform the Defendant how the deceased was killed.
- 8. The allegations of the Indictment do not show whether the deceased was killed by being struck by Defendant's automobile or by being thrown from the automobile in which she was riding.
