Dear Taylor:

As you will recall, above named defendant was sentenced last summer by this court to the state penitentiary on three separate charges for a total of six years. However, he was returned to Florida authorities by you for completion of a sentence there, which amounted to a little over a year as I recall.

The question arose then, and at the last session of Circuit Court, as to whose responsibility it was to return the prisoner to the proper Alabama authorities, and also who was responsible for placing the hold-over with the Florida Authorities.

During the past week I have consulted a representative of the Department of Public Examiners, and was informed the following procedure should be followed in this, and similar cases.

A hold-over is placed with the proper Florida authorities by your office. After the prisoner has completed his sentence in Florida you will return him to the Baldwin County jail, and then notify the prison officials in Montgomery to pick him up as is done when any other prisoner is sent to the state penitentiary. All expenses incurred in returning the prisoner from Florida will be paid by you, and the state in turn will reimburse you upon presentation of the usual expense account record. No extradition papers should be necessary in this matter.
