The subject Bernice Long was convicted in two cases, one being Petit Larceny and the other Tampering with an Automobile. He received a sentence of six months Hard Labor in each case. The conviction in these cases took place on May 11, 1951. On the same date Judge Masnburn suspended the Jail sentence in each case and placed the subject on probation until he reached the age of 21. Also on the same date this officer interviewed the subject at which time he was instructed as to the conditions of probation and at the same time was given an Order of Probation. He was also instructed as to the procedure in filing monthly reports. The probation plan was for the subject to live with his mother and father Mr. and Mrs. Earl Long at Foley, Alabama. He was to work for Mr. Elmore Hendericks who is in the nursery business at Foley.

At the time of the initial interview which was the same day he was placed on probation the subject's attitude was arrogant. He appeared to be a smart alecky, refusing to answer certain questions and more or less resented certain restrictions imposed by this officer. It was felt at the time that the subject was going to be a problem because of his attitude. It was only three days after he was placed on probation that he got into the present trouble. The subject was interviewed at the Baldwin County Jail on May 28th, at which time he stated that he just could not make it on probation, that is why he broke into the Duke's Pool Room.

It is this officer's recommendation that the subject's probation be revoked. The subject at the present time is incarcerated in the Baldwin County Jail.
