The State of Alabama, by its Solicitor, complains of Eugene W. Marrow, whose name is to  
your informant otherwise unknown, \_\_\_\_\_ that

in said county and within twelve months before the commencement of this prosecution he did  
aid, encourage, or cause Odal Campbell, a child under sixteen years of age, to  
become delinquent, or has by word, act or omission, threats, commands or persuasion,  
induced or endeavored to induce, aided or encouraged said child to do or perform  
an act, or to follow a course of conduct which would cause or manifestly tend to  
~~cause such child to become or remain delinquent, in that the said Eugene W. Marrow~~  
did drive the said child around in his car late at night in the company of Charles  
Merritt, a boy of the age of, to-wit, twenty years, or did condone the acts of  
said Charles L. Merritt who kissed the said child or who gave or attempted to  
give the said child intoxicating liquor,

contrary to law and against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.

acknowledge ourselves indebted to Baldwin County, Alabama, in the sum of

Three Hundred DOLLARS

for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our administrators and executors. But the condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the Juvenile Court of said County did on the 22nd day of September, 1922, make and enter a final order of judgment, whereby the above bounden Eugene Marrow

was convicted for Contributing to Delinquency of a minor child and sentenced to three(3) months hard labor

and whereas the above bounden Eugene Marrow has prayed and obtained an appeal from said order, to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama.

Now, if the said Eugene Marrow

shall appear in said Circuit Court when said case is called for trial, and from time to time thereafter until discharged by law, and shall answer such judgment as shall be rendered on said appeal, and shall pay all costs that may accrue on said appeal, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect. And as against this obligation we waive all right under the laws of Alabama to claim any personal property as exempt from levy and sale.




