TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF THE TWENTY-EIGHTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF ALABAMA:

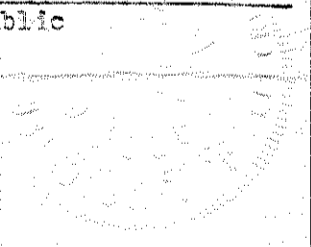
