The Grand Jury of said County further charge that before the finding of this indictment FRANK GEORGE, whose name is to the Grand Jury otherwise unknown, with intent to steal, broke into and entered a chicken house, which was a structure within the curtilage of the dwelling house of Sophia Bendik, which structure was specially constructed for the keeping of goods or chickens, things of value, for use, sale, or deposit,

against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
