3. The allegations of the indictment are vague, indefinite and uncertain in that it does not specifically describe the property alleged to have been stolen.

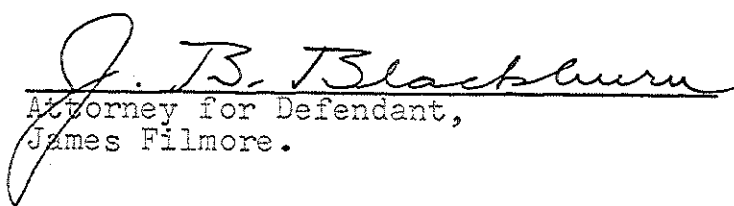
4. The indictment does not describe the property alleged to have been stolen with certainty as required by law.

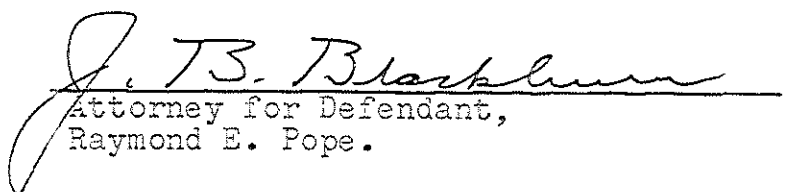
