Dear Sir.

I am writing you about my son Henry
Quor who is in the jail in Bay Minette and
I would like you to please have mercy on him
and have him examined for insanity as I know
he isn't in his right mind to do these things as
he has always been a kind gentle boy and
didn't want to see anyone hurt. He never had a
home life like other children as I left his
father when he was only 9 yrs. old and I never
knew it till this happened that his life was
pretty hectic till I took him with me. I was
working at time and had a home where he could
stay but guess it was to late. It is a very hard
thing for me to believe what I read in papers as it
is all the way I have to learn anything about it
and I never knew him to travel alone and can't see
how it happened this way now.

I beg of you please have him examined
and do what you can for him as I am only a
poor sickly woman now with heart trouble and
high blood pressure and can't travel alone so I
have to sit here and let him think he is let

down by the one that should believe in him and believe me it is terrible for me all I have is my trust in the Lord that he will help.

I am married again and have to wait till my husband can get time off from his work to make the trip. I can't travel alone as I have high blood pressure and heart trouble and pass out by spells and I am not safe alone. Just got piece with picture of him being taken back to his cell and believe me my heart goes out to him as I know he isn't as he should be. He done a two year hitch in Army before and was injured in a skiing operation and also contracted a tropical fever which affected him very often and he has severe headaches at times and he also had his back hurt by being knocked down a flight of stairs when he was in school. I think he is just a poor disillusioned boy and feels as if he is alone to face the world but I am willing to help him if he would come to me and only let me know. Kindly let me know where he will be so I may go to him soon please help me by doing something for this poor boy as he needs medical aid. please look into this right away

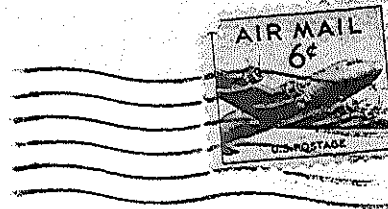

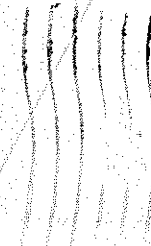
