Supplementary Offense Report

Complainant -- Ira Coughlan

Victim--

On Tuesday morning (June 24), Mr. Odom, Cattle inspector for the state, came to the Sheriff's Office on the complaint of Mr. Ira Coughlan. ~~We went to Mr. Ira Coughlan.~~ We went to Mr. Ira Coughlan's at Tensaw, Ala. and talked with him and he told us he had about 25 head of stock missing. (10 cows, 10 calves, & 5 yearlings.) He had heard that Murry Bryant Jr. had gotten Mr. Henry Pipkins cows and carried them to Frisco, City, Ala. and sold them. We then took Mr. Coughlan and went to Frisco City, Ala. stock yard and checked the records on Murry Bryant Jr. We found out he had sold 3 cows on May 28th at the sale. The cows were Mr. Henry Pipkins missing stock. We came back to Stockton, Ala and talked with Mr. Dennis Thompson. He told us that Murry Bryant Sr. had come to him and said his son Murry Bryant Jr. had taken three cows belonging to Mr. Pipkins and sold them. Mr. Bryant wanted Mr. Thompson to help him get the matter straightened out with Mr. Pipkins. Mr. Thompson said a colored boy Lovett Brown helped Murry Bryant Jr. take the cows. We picked up Lovett Brown and brought him to County Jail for questioning. He told us prior to the theft of Mr. Pipkins cows, they had gone up on Highway 59 below Slaughter's Store and picked up three cows and about a week later they went up on the Jack Spring Rd. and got three more.

The next day June 25 th Mr. Odom, his son and I went to Atmore Stock Yards and checked records on sales there. We found that no cows had been sold by Murry Bryant Jr. in the last three months there. We went on to Jay, Florida and checked records there. No record on Murry Bryant Jr. at all. On the same day we went to Brewton, Alabama and checked records at the stock yard there. No record was found on any of the stolen cows.

June 26th we checked records at Robertsedale, Ala. No record was found on suspect or stolen cows. June 27th we talked again with Lovett Brown, he repeated the same story he had previously told us. He also said they had picked up a bull belonging to Mr. Thompson at Live Oak Landing and put him in the same pen. We then went to Stockton, Ala. and picked up Murry Bryant Jr. and brought him to County Jail for questioning. He admitted taking the three cows of Mr. Pipkins and selling them at the sale pen in Frisco City, But he denied taking any other cows. We then brought Lovett Brown down stairs to the same room where we were questioning Murry Bryant Jr. Lovett Brown then denied getting any cows at Slaughter's Store or on the Jack Spring Rd. The admitted going to both places looking for cows but said they didn't find any. They had roped a cow out close to Mr. Drinard's on Jack Spring Rd. but was afraid some one saw them so they turned it loose.

They are trying to settle the matter with Mr. Pipkins and as of now there has been no charge made on suspects.

In our checking we haven't been able to find any of the other missing cows.

Downey Hasting field. The next morning Murry Bryant Jr. loaded the cows
and carried them to Frisco City, Ala. and sold them at the sale pen.
A Mr. Gene Garrett bought the cow and calf and has them on his farm at
Uriah, Ala. Mr. Johnson, who Bought the yearling, lives just outside of
Frisco City,
The cow and calf sale tag number was 925 & 926. The cow and calf
together brought one hundred dollars.
