We came to Foley about 9:00 P.M. Tuesday, June 9, 1959. We tried to go in the door where there was a glass broke. We couldn't get in. Then we went around to the other side, broke a glass, there was a board over the glass. Webb climber in there, then he climbed up to where one of the big windows in the back and opened it and climbed in there. We went through a swinging door and went in the store part. We went from there to the registers. We took the money out of the registers, while we were doing that, Webb said he was going to find him a knife. When we got ready to go, James picked up three (3) cans of peanuts. We went out of the door that raised up in the back of the store. Then we crossed the street and started toward Elberta. Webb had a sling shot and some cigarets. It was raining and we stopped at a Waiting Station at Barin Field. We sat there 30 minutes to an hour. We stopped some some other places under a pourch. We left there just about day light and we went down to the Bridge. I went to sleep. Whenever we woke up, they wanted to go see some girls. They went to Silver Hill to see a girl they knew. Webb had the money in two (2) socks. We left the suit case under the bridge. I started to go see a girl, but it started to rain. It was about 11:00 A.M. 6-10-59. They came back about 4:00 P.M., they had the money. Webb started back to Mobile. We stopped at a station to get a drink. The police picked us up.
