This is a free and voluntary statement on my part, with no promises of immunity, nor threats against me, having been made.

We got to Foley Tuesday, 6-9-59. We went to Elberta. We came back to Foley that night. We went in the Red & White Super Market. We helped Webb go in the back door. After we got a piece of board off and glass off the door, he went and opened a window for us to get in. We looked around and went up in the office. We saw a deep sea rod and reel up there. I said not to fool with it. We went down stairs and looked around, and opened a door. It was locked, we went to the other door. We went up to the front of the store. I went to the first cash register and Peter went to the second and Webb started to help me. I told him to go on as he didn't have any gloves on. He left and I didn't know where he went. That was the last I saw of him until I started talking to Bill Peters. He was in an office by the Coca Cola box. We took the money and left after we looked around for a little bit. We walked all the way to Elberta. We stayed there the rest of the night. Me and Webb went to Silver Hill. We came to Elberta and got our things. Webb said he was going to Mobile. When we got in town, Mr. Willis picked us up.


