PRESENT OFFENCE:

Case #3114: Investigation of this offence revealed that on Sunday, April 17, 1960 at approximately 2:30 P.M. this subject and accomplice, Charles Caraway who is subject's brother-in-law, went to Mr. Elbert Rice's place located in the northern part of Baldwin County, Alabama. Both subjects entered a tool shed and took one Evenrude outboard 15 H.P. motor, one David Bradley chain saw, one three ton com-a-long and one hand saw. These items were placed in the car which belonged to this subject. They then drove down the road to a house occupied or in the possession of Mr. Henry Cumbie. Subjects went into the house and took one .12 gauge pump shotgun and one chain saw from this house. No one was home at the time and the house was not locked. These items were taken to this subject's accomplice, Charles Caraway's home in East Brewton, Alabama.

Subject was arrested on July 11, 1960 at which time he waived his Preliminary Hearing and was bound over to the Grand Jury on \$500.00 bond. Subject was released on bond same day. Subject was indicted by the Fall, 1960 Grand Jury for the offence of Burglary 2nd degree. On September 17, 1960, subject was arraigned and entered a plea of guilty to Burglary 2nd degree as charged in the indictment and requested benefits of probation. A Pre-Sentence Investigation was ordered on that day. The case is set for Tuesday, September 27, 1960. Subject's accomplice, Charles Caraway, a brother-in-law, also entered a plea of guilty and requested probation.

PERSONAL HISTORY:Family Situation:

Father: Elijah Franklin Ferrell, age 67, lives in Stockton, Alabama and is a retired farmer and shipyard worker. He has spent his entire life in Baldwin and Escambia Counties. He drinks occasionally. He is married and has nine children.

This subject is not a member and does not attend church.


