This cause coming on to be heard on this date and being submitted on the sworn Petition of J. H. Williams, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama filed on July 29, 1938; the Waiver of Service signed by L. T. Rhodes former Vice President of the Baldwin County Bank and filed on July 30, 1938, and the Waiver of Service filed in this cause by the Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, on July 30, 1938, and upon consideration thereof the Court is of the opinion that Petitioner is entitled to the relief prayed for in his said Petition, and IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Court as follows:

1. That service in this cause having been waived by L. T. Rhodes, former Vice President of the Baldwin County Bank which closed on January 27, 1932, and by the Baldwin County Bank, the Court may proceed to hear the said Petition on this date without further notice to any other parties.

2. That the averments of fact set out in the said Petition are true.

3. That in the opinion of the Court it is to the best interest of all parties interested in the said assets in liquidation which are being liquidated under the former decrees of this Court that the Union Producing Company, a Corporation be given the seven oil leases referred to in the said Petition, copies of which are thereto attached, and the making and execution of the said leases is hereby in all respects fully authorized, the said leases to be made and executed by the reorganized Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, and approved by Frank Bunkley, the representative of the Petitioner as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, who are hereby directed to immediately make and execute the said leases.

PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF BALDWIN  
COUNTY, ALABAMA, SITTING IN EQUITY:

Your Petitioners, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of Commerce  
and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and the Baldwin  
County Bank, a State Banking Corporation, each respectfully represent  
unto the Court and your Honor as follows:

1. The Baldwin County Bank, a State Banking Corporation,  
as it then existed, closed on January 27, 1932, and was on the said  
date surrendered to H. H. Montgomery, who was then Superintendent of  
Banks of the State of Alabama, for liquidation.

The liquidation of the said bank proceeded as provided by  
law, under the direction of the said H. H. Montgomery, as Superintend-  
ent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and his duly constituted and  
appointed liquidation agents until on to-wit, October 14, 1932,  
when the said bank was reorganized as provided by law which will fully  
appear from the Court's Decree in this said cause dated October 14,  
1932, after which and on to-wit, October 31, 1932, H. H. Montgomery,  
as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, surrendered all  
property of every kind and nature connected with the liquidation to  
the said reorganized bank and took its receipt therefor but did not  
make any deed conveying any interest that he has as such officer  
may have had in the real property connected with the said liquidation  
and no such deed has since been made by his successors in office. The  
reorganized Baldwin County Bank opened and commenced business on  
November 1, 1932, and since the said date the liquidation of the  
said assets has been handled by the said reorganized bank as provided  
by the former decrees of this court and under the direction of H. H.  
Montgomery, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama,

J. H. Williams, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, James B. Little, as Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and Addie Lee Farish, as Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama in their respective capacities as Statutory Receiver in the manner provided by law, all of which will fully appear from the petitions filed, and from the orders and decrees of this Court rendered in this cause, reference to all of which is hereby made as though the same were fully incorporated herein.

2. A large amount of real estate was included in the said assets in liquidation and from November 1, 1932 up to this time the said Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, in connection with its duties in the said liquidation, has sold many tracts of real estate, the dates of the conveyances, the names of the respective grantees and the places of recording the said instruments will fully appear from Exhibit "A" hereto attached and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, all of which said conveyances by the said Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation were in such form that they conveyed all present title of the said corporation in and to the property described in the said conveyances and in addition thereto conveyed any after acquired title which the said corporation might acquire in the said property. Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, desires to make, execute and deliver to the Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, a deed conveying any and all right, title and interest that she as such officer now has and that which her predecessors in office may have had to all of the said property in order that the title of the respective grantees named in the various deeds shown by Exhibit "A" hereto attached and those now claiming under them will be perfected and she, as such officer desires to also convey all such right, title and interest in and to all other property sold and conveyed by the said Baldwin County Bank between November 1, 1932 and this date to the said Baldwin County Bank for the aforesaid purpose regardless of whether or not the said conveyances by which the said

Baldwin County Bank sold and conveyed the said property are described in the said Exhibit "A".

3. During all of the time that the said liquidation has continued Petitioners, together with their agents, servants and employees, have handled the said liquidation to the best of their ability and have sold the greater part of the property belonging to the said trust at the best possible prices and have had various offers for parts of the property which still belong to the said trust but the prices offered therefor have not been satisfactory to your Petitioners and in keeping with their idea as to the value of such property so that the said property was not sold but still belongs to the said trust. The liquidation of the assets belonging to the said trust has reached the place where it is to the best interest of all parties concerned in the said liquidation that it be completed and finally closed as soon as possible in order that all possible expense in connection therewith can be saved but before such liquidation can be completed and finally sold it will be necessary for Petitioners to sell the remaining assets belonging to the said trust. Petitioners further allege that all of the assets belonging to the said trust which are more particularly described in Exhibit "B" hereto attached and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein are worth the sum of \$10,307.17 and they further allege that the Baldwin Properties Company, a Corporation, which has been organized to purchase all of the said remaining assets, has made a cash offer of \$10,307.17 for all of the said property. Petitioners further allege that the said sum is a fair price for the said property, the best offer that Petitioners have received therefor, that it is to the best interest of all parties in any way concerned in the said liquidation that the said offer be accepted, the said property sold, conveyed, transferred and delivered to the said purchaser and that thereafter the said liquidation be closed with all convenient dispatch.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS.

Petitioners pray that the Court will take jurisdiction of

the cause made by this Petition, that it will appoint and set a day to hear and determine same and give notice thereof in the form and manner prescribed by law to all necessary and proper parties.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

On a final hearing of this cause Petitioners pray for the following separate and several relief:

1. That Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, be authorized, directed and instructed to make, execute and deliver a deed to the Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, conveying all right, title and interest which she as such officer now has and which her predecessors in office may have had to all of the lands described in the deeds referred to in Exhibit "A" hereto attached, together with all such right, title and interest in and to all of the said property that was conveyed by the said Baldwin County Bank from November 1, 1932 to this date, regardless of whether or not the deeds conveying same are set out and specifically described in the said Exhibit "A" in order that the title of the respective purchasers and those claiming under them will be thereby perfected.

2. That Petitioners be authorized, instructed and directed to accept the said offer for the said assets described in Exhibit "B" hereto attached, that each of them be authorized, instructed, ordered and directed to make, execute and deliver all such deeds, assignments, transfers and indorsements or either, which may be necessary to properly convey and transfer to the said Baldwin Properties Company, a Corporation, all of the assets of every kind and nature except cash on hand belonging to the said trust or assets in liquidation.

3. Petitioners further pray for such other, further and general relief as they, or either of them may be equitably entitled to, the premises considered.

TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA, SITTING IN EQUITY:

Now comes Addie Lee Farish, as Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, in her capacity as such officer and respectfully shows unto your Honor as follows:

1. Petitioner is over twenty-one years of age, resides in Montgomery County, Alabama, and is the duly qualified and acting Director of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and as such officer is statutory receiver and trustee in fact for all banks in liquidation, their stockholders and creditors.

2. In the interest of brevity and for convenience in reference, the following abbreviations and terms herein defined, when used herein, will be deemed to have the following meanings unless the context otherwise clearly indicates: "Bank" means the Baldwin County Bank, an Alabama Corporation, having its principal office at Bay Minette in Baldwin County, Alabama as it was constituted prior to the reorganization and reopening thereof; "Reorganized Bank" means said Baldwin County Bank as constituted after such reorganization and reopening; "Plan" means the plan of reorganization of said bank, an unsigned copy of which is attached as Exhibit "A" to the Petition of H. H. Montgomery filed in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama on September 28, 1932, the originals being on file in the said reorganized bank.

3. The "Bank" closed on to-wit, January 27, 1932, was surrendered to the then Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama for liquidation, remained in liquidation until November 1, 1932 when it was reorganized and reopened according to the terms and provisions of a decree rendered in this cause and dated October 14, 1932. Since the said "Reorganized Bank" commenced business it has handled the liquidation of the assets of the "Bank" under the direction of Petitioner and her predecessors in office as provided by law, all of which will fully appear from the court proceedings covering the said liquidation and reorganization as the same appear in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, Sitting in Equity, being case Number 1030;

and in order to avoid unduly extending this Petition reference is hereby made to all petitions filed in this cause, to the facts therein set out and to all of the orders made and decrees rendered thereon, all of which are by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, the last relevant decree in the said proceeding was dated July 12, 1937 in which decree the court reserved jurisdiction of the said cause for such other and further action as may be or become necessary. At the time of the reorganization of the said "Reorganized Bank" as will fully appear from the former proceedings in this cause whole shares of stock in the said "Reorganized Bank" were issued to each depositor or common creditor who had \$100.00 on deposit in the "Bank" which closed on January 27, 1932, and fractional shares of stock were issued to each depositor or common creditor who had more than \$2.66 and less than \$100.00 on deposit in the said bank. A true copy of the fractional share certificate so issued is hereto attached marked Exhibit "A" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein. The owners of the said fractional shares have no voting power and no dividends are payable on the said stock. Petitioner further alleges that the issuance of stock to the depositors and creditors of the "Bank" as provided in the said "Plan" was merely a form of dividend to such depositors and creditors and if said stock cannot be delivered to the owners thereof it should be converted into cash and the cash handled as unclaimed deposits in the manner provided by law.

4. No dividends have been paid by the said "Reorganized Bank" up to this time and it is now in the process of reducing its capital stock to the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars and eliminating its fractional shares of stock so issued by paying par value therefor and cancelling and retiring same.

5. Since the date of the reorganization of the said "Reorganized Bank" a diligent effort has been made by the "Reorganized Bank" by Petitioner's predecessors in office and by Petitioner, her agents, servants and employees to deliver each and every whole and fractional share of stock so issued by the said "Reorganized Bank" at

the time of the said reorganization after having exhausted all efforts to contact the owners of all of the said whole and fractional shares there still remains on hand in the "Reorganized Bank" the following described whole and fractional shares, the names of the owners thereof and the amounts being as shown by Exhibit "B" hereto attached and made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein.

6. The liquidation of the assets of the "Bank" is rapidly being completed and when the liquidation of the said assets is completed there is no authority of law for carrying or transferring the said undelivered stock and before the liquidation is completed the said stock should, in the opinion of Petitioner, be converted into cash in order that the amounts realized therefrom and due the said parties can be handled as unclaimed deposits and held and finally disbursed as provided by Section 6324 of the 1923 Code of Alabama. Petitioner can sell all undelivered whole shares of stock and get therefor the par value thereof and can surrender for cancellation all of the said undelivered fractional shares of stock and realize therefor the par value thereof which is, in the opinion of Petitioner the reasonable market value of the said stock, none of which has, up to this time been sold for more than par but much of which has been sold for less than par. Petitioner is of the opinion and therefore alleges that it is to the best interest of the "Reorganized Bank" and to all of the depositors and creditors of the "Bank" that the said whole and fractional shares of stock which are now on hand and which are specifically described in this petition be converted into cash as soon as possible. The parties owning the said undelivered stock certificates are numerous and cannot, without manifest inconvenience and oppressive delays in this proceeding, be given notice of this petition and of the day set for hearing same, but all of the said parties were heretofore made parties to the proceeding under which the said "Reorganized Bank" was reorganized in strict accord with the statute under which the said bank was reorganized and in all of the said proceedings jurisdiction of the said cause has been reserved for such other and further proceedings as might become necessary.



7. Petitioner is informed and believes and therefore alleges that in the "Plan" for reorganization under which the "Reorganized Bank" was reorganized and commenced business it was the intention of all interested parties that the certificates of deposit which were issued at the time of the said reorganization and which are dated October 25, 1932, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and by reference made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, be paid only from the assets of the "Bank" in liquidation, that it was not contemplated or intended that said certificates of deposit should be a charge on the "Reorganized Bank", its earnings, assets, capital or surplus and further that it was the intention of all interested parties that the assets described in the former decrees of this court to constitute the capital and surplus of the "Reorganized Bank" and all increase, earnings or profits therefrom, be free from any and all claims of every kind and nature as is clearly stated in the Petition of H. H. Montgomery for the reorganization of said "Bank", but while the intention of the parties and the court can easily be ascertained from the "Plan", from the said Petition and from the proceedings heretofore had and decrees rendered in this cause, Petitioner believes and therefore alleges that it is to the best interest of the "Reorganized Bank", its stockholders, depositors and creditors, to the best interest of all depositors and creditors of the "Bank" and all other interested parties that Petitioner be instructed by the Court as to whether the said Certificates of Deposit constitute a charge on the capital, surplus, earnings or profits of the said "Reorganized Bank" and further instructed as to what funds or assets are charged with the payment of the said certificates of deposit. Petitioner further alleges that certificates of stock and certificates of deposit were originally issued to the same person, that each person who was issued a share of stock or fractional share of stock at the time of the said reorganization was also issued a certificate of deposit as provided in the "Plan" and that the present holders of the certificates of deposit are the present holders of the certificate of stock except in cases where some of the said parties

have sold and transferred the whole or fractional shares of stock owned by them, said certificates of deposit being non-negotiable. Petitioner further alleges that a five per cent dividend on the said certificates of deposit was paid on to-wit, January 1, 1938, a five per cent dividend was paid thereon on to-wit, January 1, 1939, and a ten per cent dividend was paid thereon on to-wit, January 1, 1940, all of which payments were made from the proceeds of collections and from the proceeds of the said sale of property belonging to the assets of the "Bank" in liquidation and from no other source.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS.

Petitioner prays that the Court will take jurisdiction of the cause made by this Petition, will set a day to hear and determine same and will give notice thereof in the form and manner prescribed by law to all necessary and proper parties.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF.

On a final hearing of this cause Petitioner prays for the following separate and several relief:

1. That Petitioner be authorized and directed to convert the said undelivered whole and fractional shares of stock described in this petition into cash as provided in this petition to be held as unclaimed deposits and disbursed as provided by Section 6324 of the 1923 Code of Alabama.

2. That Petitioner be instructed as to whether the certificates of deposit described in this petition constitute a charge on the capital, surplus, earnings or proceeds of the said "Reorganized Bank" and further instructed as to what funds or assets are charged with the payment of the said certificates of deposit.

3. Petitioner further prays for such other, further and general relief as he may be equitably entitled to the premises considered.

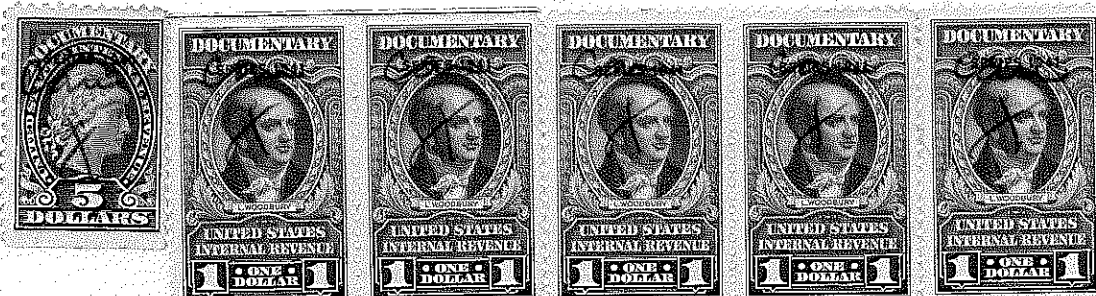

COUNTY, ALABAMA, SITTING IN EQUITY:

Your Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of  
the Department of Commerce and as Superintendent of Banks of the  
State of Alabama and the Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, respect-  
fully represent unto the Court and your Honor as follows:

1. That on January 27, 1932 the Baldwin County  
Bank, a Corporation, of Bay Minette, Alabama, acting under a reso-  
lution of its Board of Directors, closed its doors and surrendered  
its assets and affairs to the Honorable H. H. Montgomery, the then  
Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama who received the  
assets and affairs of the said bank for the purpose of liquidation  
which commenced and proceeded under the supervision of this Honor-  
able Court, all of which will appear from the petitions filed in  
this cause and from the orders and decrees rendered thereon,  
reference to all of which is hereby made as though the same were  
fully incorporated herein.

2. At the time this Court assumed jurisdiction of  
the liquidation of the said Bank the said H. H. Montgomery was  
Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama and as such officer  
had charge of the liquidation of the said Bank until November 1, 1932,  
when the said Bank was reopened under its original charter after  
having been reorganized in the manner provided by a Decree of this  
Court rendered in this cause on October 14, 1932 and after the said  
reorganization the liquidation of the said Bank was handled by the  
said reorganized bank under the direction of the said H. H. Montgomery  
as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama until April,  
1934, at which time J. H. Williams became Superintendent of Banks of  
the State of Alabama as successor to the said H. H. Montgomery,

and as such officer supervised the liquidation of the affairs of the said Bank until January 17, 1939 when James B. Little became Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama as successor to the said J. H. Williams and supervised the liquidation of the said Bank until October 28, 1940, when Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, became Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama as successor to the said James B. Little, and since said date has superintended the liquidation of the said bank as provided by law and now has such charge thereof. A. E. Jackson was duly appointed and served as liquidating agent of the said Bank from January 27, 1932 until on to-wit, August 5, 1932, at which time the said A. E. Jackson resigned as such liquidating agent of the said bank and W. J. Osborne was appointed liquidating agent for said bank by the Honorable H.H.Montgomery, the then Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and served as such liquidating agent until on to-wit, November 1, 1932, on which date the said reorganized bank reopened and commenced business.

3. That after this Court by its decree of October 14, 1932 authorized the reorganization and reopening of the said Baldwin County Bank, and on to-wit, the 29th day of October, 1932, H. H. Montgomery, as the then Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama filed in this Court his petition, accounts and vouchers covering his liquidation of the assets and affairs of the said bank during the period of time between January 27, 1932 and October 29, 1932 and on October 31, 1932 this said Court rendered a Decree in this cause passing and allowing the accounts so filed by the said H. H. Montgomery, and discharged him as such officer, his agents, servants and employees from all liability in connection with the said liquidation, reference to which said proceedings is hereby made as though the same were fully incorporated herein and on the said date the said H. H. Montgomery, as such officer, delivered all of the assets of the said liquidation to the said reorganized Baldwin County Bank and took its receipt therefor.

4. The said reorganized Baldwin County Bank commenced its liquidation of the said assets on to-wit, November 1, 1932,

and continued the same under the direction of the said J. H. Williams, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama until the 1st day of July, 1937, when the said J. H. Williams filed a petition in this cause praying among other things that the liquidation of the assets of the said bank from November 1, 1932 to said date be approved, ratified and confirmed. The said reorganized Bank joined in the prayer of the said petition and on to-wit, July 12, 1937, this Court rendered a Decree in this cause passing and allowing the accounts so filed, reference to which is hereby made as though the same were fully incorporated herein; that from July 12, 1937 the further liquidation of the assets and affairs of the said Bank has been handled by the reorganized bank under the direction of the various Superintendents of Banks of the State of Alabama during the time they held such office.

5. The affairs of the said liquidation have now reached the place where there is no need for a continuation thereof and the said liquidation should now in all respects be fully and finally settled.

6. Petitioners file herewith an itemized and detailed statement covering that period of time from June 21, 1937 through October 31, 1941, marked Exhibit "A", each sheet of which is identified by the signature of Addie Lee Farish, as Director of the Department of Commerce and Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, and made a part hereof as though fully incorporated herein, showing what was received in liquidating the affairs of the said bank, what disposition was made in the assets of the said bank, showing the various receipts and disbursements, the general expense of the liquidation and a summary of the losses had in the operation and liquidation of the affairs of the said bank.

7. Petitioners also file herewith a statement of unpaid claims against the said bank growing out of the said liquidation which is marked Exhibit "B", each sheet of which is identified by the signature of Addie Lee Farish, as Director of the Department of Commerce and as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, that if said claims are allowed and approved for pay-

ment by this Court there will then remain in the hands of Petitioners the sum of to-wit, \$17,594.76 for final dividend to the general creditors and depositors of the said bank. Petitioners further show that they have collected, sold and otherwise disposed of all of the assets in liquidation of the said Baldwin County Bank under the prior orders, decrees and directions of this Court and there now remains in Petitioners' hands no assets of the said bank pertaining to or connected with the said liquidation other than the cash on hand for payment of the final claims and final dividends. Petitioners further represent that there is now stored in the Town of Bay Minette, Alabama, all of the old records and papers pertaining to the said liquidation which records or papers are in the opinion of Petitioners of no further value and should be destroyed in accordance with the usual regulations and customs of the office of the Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, there being no permanent storage space for their preservation. Petitioners further represent that upon payment of the final dividend to the creditors and depositors of the said bank, all of the affairs of the said liquidation will then be wound up and completed and that the above mentioned Exhibits "A" and "B" are full and complete statements showing the final distribution of the said property belonging to the said bank.

8. Petitioners further represent that there are many unclaimed deposits among the moneys on hand belonging to the said liquidation which unclaimed deposits will be handled in the manner prescribed by law; that is to say, they will be held by the Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama for a period of six months after the order for final distribution and then deposited in one or more state banks at interest to the credit of the Superintendent of Banks in her official capacity in trust for the several depositors and creditors of the said liquidated bank as provided by Title 5 Section 73 of the 1940 Code of Alabama, and at the expiration of three years from the date of the final liquidation

of the said bank shall then be certified and transmitted to the State Treasurer of the State of Alabama as provided by Title 5, Section 74 of the 1940 Code of Alabama; that in certifying the unclaimed deposits to the said Treasurer of the State of Alabama in the manner provided by law, Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of the Department of Commerce and as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama will incur further expense in so certifying and transferring the said funds which said expense should be paid therefrom.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioners respectfully pray for the following separate and several relief:

1. That the Court will take jurisdiction of the cause made by this petition for final settlement, will appoint and set a day to hear and determine same and give notice thereof to all necessary and proper parties in the form and manner prescribed by law.

2. That on the day set the Court will make and enter a proper decree fully and finally settling the liquidation in all respects authorizing petitioners to pay the necessary charges and expenses shown by Exhibit "B" hereto attached; that petitioners be authorized to destroy all of the old records and papers of said bank pertaining to the said liquidation now stored at Bay Minette, Alabama; that the partial settlements of the said liquidation made on to-wit, October 31, 1932 and on July 12, 1937 be fully ratified and confirmed, that all transactions had, proceedings taken and actions performed by Petitioner, Addie Lee Farish, as Director of the Department of Commerce and as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, by H. H. Montgomery, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, by J. H. Williams, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, by James B. Little, as Superintendent of Banks of the State of Alabama, their respective liquidating agents and their agents, servants and employees, by the reorganized Baldwin County Bank, a Corporation, its officers, directors, agents, servants and employees be in all respects ratified and confirmed;



that the said petition for final settlement filed herein be approved, ratified and confirmed and that upon the distribution of the funds now on hand and herein reported to the creditors and depositors of the said bank, all of the said parties and the sureties on their respective bonds be forever discharged from all other and further liability on account of the liquidation of the assets of the Baldwin County Bank.

3. on hand the sum of \$17,591.75 to be used in paying the final dividend  
to the depositors and creditors of the said bank; that \$663.47 of  
this said amount was used in paying off depositors and creditors  
whose claims had been carried in a suspense account, which payments  
were made in strict accord with all of the provisions of the Court's  
said decree of November 27, 1941; that the balance of the said  
moneys amounting to \$16,928.28 was used in setting up a final  
dividend of 11.95% to the depositors and creditors of the said bank;

that checks covering the final dividend has been prepared and are now being delivered to the depositors and creditors who are entitled to receive the same; that the said checks will be delivered to the said depositors and creditors or held and handled in the manner provided by law. Having fully complied with all of the terms and provisions of the Court's said Decree of November 27, 1941, Petitioners' Report as contained herein should be confirmed and Petitioners, their agents, servants, employees, officers and directors should be fully and finally discharged from all liability in connection with the said liquidation.

WHEREFORE, Petitioners pray that the Court will make and enter a decree confirming this their final report and discharging Petitioners, their officers, agents, servants, employees and directors from any and all liability of every kind and nature which exists or may exist because of or in connection with the liquidation of the assets and affairs of the said Baldwin County Bank. Petitioners further pray that such other orders may be made and decrees rendered as may be requisite and proper in the premises.
