



In connection with his report as administrator of the estate of Henry Crawford, deceased, filed this day, March 26, 1931, the undersigned, desires to present the following memoranda.

On assuming the duty of administrator it was the belief that the estate, with judicious handling might pay off all indebtedness and yield something for the widow and minor child.

With this in mind it appeared necessary, all the income producing assets being held as collateral by creditors, to take such action, as would prevent the creditors from taking possession of the hypothecated personal property.

In this view the first item of disbursement, \$52.50 was paid Mrs. M.C.Slaton, who held as collateral 15 shares of Baldwin Credit Company Stock, at that time paying dividends of 1% a month and a share in the Fairhope Realty Cobelieved to be of equal value.

In this view, a note of the Bank of Fairhope for \$1,000 ment for which it held as collateral ten shares of Baldwin Credit Co. Stock, paying 12%, the administrator paid \$20 interest for renewal of the note for 90 days.

In the same view \$70 interest was paid Matie R. Peters, on a note for \$2,000 for which she held as collateral \$3,000 worth of Baldwin Credit Co. Stock.

In regard to item of June 2, 1930, "Paid Fairhope Single Tax Corporation, rent on 'Ring Farm' to prevent loss"; the Single Tax Corporation, as it was entitled to under its lease contract with one Mrs. Ida J. Bradford, (assigned to Mr. Crawford) was about to sell the improvements on the land (belived to be worth around \$4,000) for the delinquent wand and the administrator felt it necessary and in the interest of the state and its creditors, to prevent the loss of this property to the estate, and bid in the claim of the Single Tax Corporation, at the sale; applying thereto the tax receipt of Jesse Smithan, county tax collector for which remittance was made to him May 24; and check of \$166.53 to the Treasurer of the Fairhope Single Tax Corp. June 2nd, and securing from the Corporation a bill of sale for the improvements.

There appear in my report two items of \$10 each paid to Mrs. M.C.Slaton for "dividend on Baldwin CaxaxxxXxxxXxxxX Credit Company stock". The administrator was shown that the share of stock in question on which the monthly dividend was twice paid to the estate, in fact was the property of Mrs. Slaton.

While not desiring to serve further as administrator I will be pleased to assist whomsoever you may appoint as my successor in any way I can,



In a previous letter to you, I have suggested that you take out letters of administration on the
Estate of Mr.Henry Crawford, because although his widow
is a woman of unusual intelligence and business capacity,
that fact is not as well known to outsiders as is yours.
Before this could be done, however, she and the largest
creditor should waive their right to administer, which
would leave it to the Probate Judge to appoint whoever he
saw fit. The bond required is double the amount of the

of the real estate. However, in estimating the value of
