By its order dated February 1st, 1939, the court authorized the payment in full of receiver's bond premiums \$70.00, receiver's fees \$888.00, and court costs \$21.50, leaving the total sum of \$1020.50 for distribution among the creditors.

This amount allows a dividend to each creditor of 46.03% and check for this final dividend is enclosed herewith.

Comes now, Lloyd A. Magney, and respectfully shows to the Court that he was appointed receiver in this matter and qualified on the 29th day of July, 1932, and that since that time he has been continuously engaged with the affairs of said estate.


That the matter was much involved and complicated and has required a great amount of time and effort on the part of the receiver.

That assets of the estate in the total amount of NINETEEN HUNDRED & 00/100 (\$1900.00) DOLLARS have come into the hands of the receiver to be distributed according to the order of the Court and that such fees as are to be allowed to the receiver for his services should be fixed at this time.

The receiver further states that a fee of twenty per cent (20%) of the amount of the money collected and disbursed would be a reasonable fee considering the time and effort involved and the results achieved.

Wherefore, he moves the Court for an order fixing and allowing the sum of THREE HUNDRED EIGHTY & 00/100 (\$380.00) DOLLARS as a fee to the receiver and ordering the payment of the same.

Figure 1 illustrates the steps of the proposed algorithm for finding a minimum spanning tree. The process starts with a graph with 10 nodes and 15 edges. The algorithm iteratively selects edges with the minimum weight, avoiding cycles and ensuring no node has a degree greater than 2. The steps are as follows:

- (a) Initial graph with 10 nodes and 15 edges.
- (b) Select edge (1,2) with weight 1.
- (c) Select edge (2,3) with weight 1.
- (d) Select edge (3,4) with weight 1.
- (e) Select edge (4,5) with weight 1.
- (f) Select edge (5,6) with weight 1.
- (g) Select edge (6,7) with weight 1.
- (h) Select edge (7,8) with weight 1.
- (i) Select edge (8,9) with weight 1.

BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA, IN CHANCERY SITTING:

Comes now Lloyd A. Magney, the duly appointed, qualified and
acting receiver in the above entitled matter and shows to the
Court:

That he was appointed such receiver on the 29th day of July,
1932, and at that time took upon himself the duties of such office.

That the assets of said Respondent, which were deposited with
the Court for safe keeping, consisted of a number of real estate
set out in Exhibit A hereto attached
mortgages/in the total face amount of \$57,000.00, each of such
mortgages being accompanied by a note and an abstract of title cov-
ering the land described in the various mortgages. These were the
only assets belonging to the Respondent which ever came into the
hands of the receiver.

While all of these mortgages were supposed to be first mort-
gages on real estate, as a matter of fact, one of them, that given
by S. G. Engstrom in the face amount of \$2,000.00 was a second
mortgage and the first mortgage has been foreclosed and the right
of redemption has expired and such mortgage and the indebtedness
secured thereby has been wholly lost and the face amount of the
assets thereby reduced to the sum of \$55,000.00.

While these mortgages and notes are, upon the face thereof,
valid and enforcible first mortgages upon real estate in Baldwin
County, Alabama, of substantial value, they are, as a matter of
fact, subject to certain infirmities as follows:

1. Each of said mortgages was given by the mortgagor in payment for shares of capital stock of the Respondent in an amount equal to the face of the mortgage; the said Respondent failed and was enjoined by this Court from continuing its business and said stock certificates were and are, wholly without value.

2. Said mortgages all fall due on July 1st, 1940, and cannot be declared due prior to that time for reasons hereinafter set out.

3. At the time each mortgagor executed a mortgage to the Respondent, he was given a contemporaneous written agreement in which the Respondent agreed with the mortgagor that he would never be called upon to pay either the principal or the interest of said mortgage but that, instead, the dividends upon the capital stock of the Respondent, purchased by the mortgagor with the said mortgage, would be applied to the payment of interest and the principal sum and would be sufficient in amount to pay the same in full.

4. That relying upon this written agreement with the Respondent, each and all of the mortgagors has failed and refused to pay any interest or principal and each takes the position that under said agreement he is not due to pay anything and that because of the failure of the Respondent and the worthlessness of the capital stock of the Respondent, the mortgage indebtedness is cancelled and said mortgage void.

5. Any attempt to enforce payment on said mortgages has merely lead to threats on the part of the mortgagors to go into Court and sue to have the mortgage set aside or declared paid by reason of the agreement which each of the mortgagors hold as aforesaid.

These infirmities in the mortgages, which do not appear on the face of them nor of record has made it impossible for the receiver to collect any part of the mortgages or to find a purchaser willing to buy the same and the receiver has been unable to realize any money out of the assets of the corporation up to this time.

The receiver is now made a firm offer by W. C. Beebe of the sum of \$1900.00, in cash, for all of the mortgages constituting the sole assets of the Respondent. The receiver is informed that in making such offer, Mr. Beebe, who is the attorney for most, if not all of the mortgagors, is acting as a trustee for the mortgagors who have raised this sum of money by voluntary assessment proportioned to the amount of stock held by each of the mortgagors and that the offer is made for the purpose of having the mortgages transferred and assigned to Mr. Beebe and that thereupon, the same will be released by him and in this way, the mortgagors will remove the cloud upon their real estate titles and that if such offer be not accepted, the mortgagors will bring suit to cancel said mortgage and remove said clouds and use this money for such purpose and the receiver states to the Court that in his opinion, it is very doubtful whether such suits could be successfully defended by the receiver.

The receiver further states that this is the only offer of any kind he has ever been able to get, that he does not believe any better offer can be obtained and that in his opinion, it is for the best interests of the estate that said offer be accepted.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner reports the matter fully to the Court and prays that the Court will enter its order authorizing the receiver to accept said offer and to assign said mortgages to W. C. Beebe upon the payment by him of the sum of \$1900.00 in cash.
