your letter came to hand while I was on a trip to Elberta. Of course you are entitled to your interest and I would be only too glad to send it to you if I had it myself. The company has no income at the present time. I haven't sold any of its properties for over a year, one or two very small checks for a little timber was practically on the income they had. They are in trouble keeping up with the bank obligations. Since last January the Elberta Bank has been getting hard-boiled, one can hardly blame them however, as conditions are such that people are losing their confidence in financial institutions everywhere.

personally, I am getting all the bad breaks. I was congratulating myself on having escaped all the Chicago bank failures, having my account in a loop bank, but finanally that did not help any. The Chicago Bank of Commerce where I had my account went under june 25th. That made me so short personally, that I had to ask Mrs. Bretz to charge my hotel accounts but I am glad to say when I came back here I was able to borrow a few dollars and pay her off. They are not making any money in the hotel either.

I will have to ask you to have a little more patience I think things will get better as far as we are concerned, this early fall as there are quite a few inquiries for farm land. Will take care of you the first opportunity I get.
