Barton, appeared in court the Judge presiding, Honorable F. W. Hare; asked the Defendant, Henry H. Barton, whether or not he had an attorney; the Defendant answered that Mr. Jenkins had been representing him, but that he was not here; the Court then asked him if he wished to take time to look up his attorney or to get another and the Defendant, Barton, answered that he did not wish to have an attorney and that he was ready for the trial. I was defendant in the case of Zell Middleton vs H. H. Barton, in the circuit court of Baldwin County and numbered 183 on the docket thereof and in which judgment was rendered in favor of the plaintiff on the 14 day of April 1936; I had never had a case in court before, either as plaintiff or defendant and before the day this case was set for trial I had employed counsel, viz, the Honorable Sam. C. Jenkins, to represent me; I had paid him part of the fee he charged and had made arrangement satisfactory to him for the balance.

When the case was called for trial on the date named Mr. Jenkins was not present and I was without counsel and I explained this to the court, and told him or wanted to tell him and thought I did tell him that I was not ready for trial because of the absence of my attorney and to have the case continued for this reason, but the court told me or I understood him to say that I would have to go to trial without an attorney and I went into trial because I thought I had to and did not know what else to do and the court gave the general charge against me and I lost the case.

I have a good defense to the suit which I am ready to verify and the facts stated in my petition for a new trial are true.

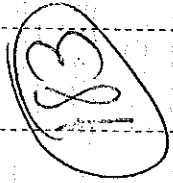

Comes the defendant, Henry H. Barton and moves the court for a new trial in the above stated cause and alleges and states:-

1st.

Defendant was not represented by counsel at the trial and did not know how to conduct his case and bring out his defense in a legal manner.

2nd.

That defendant would have asked for a continuance, but he understood that the judge said he had to try the case, and he would not continue the case.

3rd.

That he understood that a notice had been filed by his lawyer, Mr S. C. Jenkins, demanding that the plaintiff produce at the trial the note on the horse, and he did not know that it had not been done until the case was called for trial, and that this note was very material to the defense and defendant did not know that he had to call the attention of the court to the failure of the plaintiff to ~~produce~~ produce this note.

4th.

That he could show at another trial that he had an agreement with Zell Middleton, the plaintiff to return to plaintiff the said horse, and this evidence was not before the jury.

5th.

That being ignorant of the law, he did not testify, as he thought he could not testify unless he had a lawyer to represent him.

6th.

That on another trial he can show that the note was surrendered and horse taken back under a mistaken idea of his rights under the note and that afterwards he had an agreement with plaintiff to return to plaintiff the horse and for defendant to keep the cattle.

7th.

That the note which was not produced at the trial would materially affect the rights and evidence for defendant at the trial.

8th.

That defendant had witnesses to prove the transaction between plaintiff and defendant at the time the plaintiff returned the horse, but did not know how to examine these witnesses, so as to bring out these facts, neither did he testify himself, as he did not know he could do so without being represented by counsel.

9th.

That defendant if he had been represented by counsel could have shown by witnesses that the market value of the cattle sued for, was much less than proved at the trial by plaintiff.

10th.

Because defendant can show that plaintiff was not entitled to the immediate possession of said cattle, and that the title to said cattle and right to possession never did repass to plaintiff, after plaintiff returned the horse to defendant.

Defendant states that if granted a new trial, he will be represented at the next trial by counsel and will be prepared to show a good and legal defense to this action.
