Count One.

The Plaintiff claims of the defendant the sum of One Hundred and Ten(\$110) Dollars, balance due on account from him for merchandise, goods and chattels sold by the plaintiff to defendant, Howard H. Gibbs on divers dates during the month of May 1931, said sale amounting to \$170.49, and on to-wit:- October 31, 1931, defendant paid on his account,\$25.00, and on February 4, 1932, defendant paid \$25.00 and on March 30, 1932, defendant paid \$10.49 or a total of \$60.49, leaving a balance of \$110.00 and interest. Plaintiff avers that the said sum of \$110.00 with interest from May 19th. 1931, is still due and unpaid.

Plaintiff further avers that the above mentioned merchandise, goods and chattels were sold to defendant and delivered to him at specified prices and aggregating the said sum of \$170.49, and that no term of said contract was left open or undetermined by the parties, and there were no current running dealings and the account was not kept open because of contemplated future dealings. Plaintiff herewith files in this cause an itemized verified account as required by the statute.

Count Two.

Plaintiff claims of the defendant the sum of \$110.00 due on account stated between the plaintiff and defendant on to-wit.:- May 19, 1931, October 1932 February and March 1932, and divers dates during the years 1933, ~~Mar~~1934 and 1935 and 1936, which said sum of \$110.00 with interest from May 19, 1931, is still due and unpaid.
