

TO THE HONORABLE FRANCIS W. HARE, Judge of the Circuit Court of BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA, in Equity Sitting:-

LAVADA C. GLASS, Your Complainant, by this, her Bill of Complaint presented against VIRGIL GLASS, respectfully shows:-

1. That Your Complainant is and has been a bona fide resident citizen of this State for more than twelve months next preceding the filing of this Bill of Complaint; that she is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama; and that she is over the age of twenty-one years.
2. That the Respondent, VIRGIL GLASS, is a resident of the State of Alabama, residing at, to-wit: Crichton, in Mobile County, Alabama; and that the said Respondent is over the age of twenty-one years.
3. That on, to-wit: the 3rd day of August, 1929, your Complainant was married to the Respondent at Pascagoula, Mississippi; and that they lived together as man and wife from that date until, to-wit: the 2nd day of May, 1933.
4. That on or about, to-wit: the 2nd day of May, 1933, the Respondent voluntarily abandoned your Complainant, from bed and board, and that the said abandonment has been continuous for a period of more than two years next preceding the filing of this Bill of Complaint.
5. That on or about, to-wit: the 2nd day of May, 1933, the Respondent and your Complainant were separated, and that since that date your Complainant has lived separate and apart from the bed and board of the said Respondent for more than two years, continuously, and without support from him for more than two years, continuously, next preceding the filing of this Bill of Complaint; and that the said Complainant has been a bona fide resident of this State during said period.

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
6. That the said Abandonment and Separation were without cause, fault, or consent upon the part of your Complainant.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, your Complainant prays that the said VIRGIL GLASS, of Crichton, Mobile County, Alabama, be made a party Respondent to this Bill of Complaint, and that by proper notice to be served upon him as provided by law, he be notified to answer the same within the time prescribed by law, and to abide by such orders as may be made in the premises.

It is further ordered that Lavada C. Glass, the Complainant, pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.
