1. That she is over twenty-one years of age; that she is the duly qualified Administratrix of the Estate of Charlie Metz Eddins, Deceased, and is now acting as such Administratrix. such Administratrix of the said Estate she expects to be a party an action at law to be commenced in this Court.

2. The testimony of a witness, namely: L. H. Milstead of Atmore, Alabama, is necessary to the prosecution of the said and the facts generally expected to be proved by the said witness are as follows: That on July 19, 1937, he was employed by the Sherrill Oil Company, a Corporation, as a truck driver and while so employed he was driving a truck belonging to the said Sherrill Oil Company on U. S. Highway Number 31 in Baldwin County, Alabama and while approximately one and eight-tenths miles northeast of the place where U. S. Highway Number 31 intersects U. S. Highway Number 90, the truck which he was operating ran over onto or against the motor truck that was being operated by Charlie Metz Eddins; that Charlie Metz Eddins was killed by the collision and that this collision was due to the negligence of the said witness L. H. Millstead, who was then and there the agent, servant or employee of the Sherrill Oil Company, a Corporation, acting within the limit and scope of his employment.

3. The name of the party who is expected to be advised in the suit to be commenced by affiant as Administratrix of the Estate of Charlie Metz Eddins, Deceased, is the Sherrill Oil Company, a foreign corporation which is qualified to do business in the State of Alabama, whose designated agent for service of process in this State is C. N. Stallworth, of Evergreen, Alabama.


