- 3. The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant ONE HUNDRED and FIFTY (\$150.00)



 DOLLARS damages, for that whereas, on October 2nd, 1937, the Defendant sold and delivered to the Plaintiff a mule; that the Defendant falsely and fraudulently represented to the Plaintiff that the said mule was sound and free from blemishes, when, as a matter of fact, it was suffering with a defect which rendered it useless for the purposes for which the Plaintiff bought it; that the Plaintiff immediately upon the discovery of the said defect reported the same to the Defendant and was requested by the Defendant to give the mule another chance, which was done; that the said mule continued to be lame and suffer from the defect with which it was suffering at the time it was sold by the Defendant to the Plaintiff and that the said mule was then delivered to and accepted by the Defendant; that the Defendant now refuses to return the purchase price paid by the Plaintiff to the Defendant or to make any amends for damages, all to the damage of the Plaintiff, hence this suit.
