

Before me Gayle Wilder a Notary Public in and for said County and State personally appeared William Ruffles Jr. being known by me and who being duly sworn doth depose and say as follows:

(1) Deponent avers that he has a just and proper claim against John and Amy Parker for a certain debt due him as plaintiff by John and Amy Parker as defendants. And that said claim is supported by a written acknowledgment duly and properly signed by the above defendants.

(2) Deponent avers that he has made every reasonable effort to collect said account and that after having exhausted the recourses available to him, he employed Richard J. Demeree as an attorney to represent him in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama ~~at~~ *at law*.

(3) That just prior to said cause coming on to be heard before a jury as demanded by defendants that his attorney, Richard J. Demeree, gave up his private practice of law in the County of Baldwin, that he left said County and accepted employment as an attorney for the State of Alabama.

(4) Deponent avers that he is employed as a defense worker for the Alabama Dry Docks and Shipbuilding Company and that on account of the urgency of his work, he was unable to make a personal solicitation of another attorney to represent him.
