FINAL DECREE

This cause coming on to be heard on this the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1937, at the written request of the Complainants, on the bill of complaint and also upon the decree pro confesso taken against the Respondent, Grace V. Alley, and evidence as noted by the Register, and it appearing to the Court that the Complainants are entitled to the relief prayed for, and it also appearing to the court that the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White are the only heirs of the said G. A. White, deceased, and are each entitled to an undivided one-half interest in the real estate that belonged to the said G. A. White at the time of his death, and it appearing that the personal estate was sufficient to pay all the debts and expenses of said estate, and it appearing that Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White was heretofore appointed administratrix of the estate of G. A. White by the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and is now acting as such administratrix, and it appearing to the court that the said G. A. White at the time of his death owned certain lands situated in Baldwin County, Alabama, more particularly described as follows, viz: The West half of the Northwest quarter, the Northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 23, and the Northwest quarter of the southwest quarter and the southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 14, Township 6 South, Range 5 East, and that the said Grace V. Alley through fraudulent representations induced the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White to convey to her said property by a deed bearing date of February 8, 1936, and recorded in Deed Book 58 N.S. pages 526-7 Probate Records of Baldwin County, Alabama, for a nominal consideration,

and that said deed was delivered by the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White to the said Grace V. Alley, formerly Grace V. White, upon Sunday, February 9th, 1936, that said deed is void and that the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White desire to rescind said deed, and that they also desire to have the administration of said estate removed to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, for the purpose of requiring the said Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White, to pay the debts of said estate out of the personal estate thereof, and exonerate said real estate from the payment of said debts.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that said deed executed, by the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White, conveying to the said Grace V. White, now known as Grace V. Alley, the lands hereinabove described, and recorded in Deed Book 58 N.S. pages 526-7, Probate records of Baldwin County, be, and the same is hereby cancelled and held for naught.

It is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White, reconvey the lands hereinabove described to the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White, in equal shares, and that, if the said Grace V. Alley fails to execute said re-conveyance, or to deliver the same to the Register of this Court within thirty days from the date hereof, then the Register of this court shall execute said deed in the name of the said Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White, conveying said lands to the said Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White in equal shares.

It is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said Leona White pay into the Registry of this Court the sum of \$50.00 for the said Grace V. Alley, and a lien is hereby raised upon the interest of the said Leona White in said lands to secure the payment of said sum.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the administration of the estate of the said G. A. White, deceased, be, and the same is hereby removed into this Court and this court hereby assumes jurisdiction thereof, and the said Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White as administratrix of the estate of G. A. White, deceased, is hereby directed to file in this court with all convenient speed, a duly certified transcript of all letters of administration,

and all papers, petitions and inventories filed in the probate Court of this kind, since the first granting of letters in said estate in said Probate Court, together with certified transcripts of all orders of said Probate Court in said administration.

It is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that the costs of this proceeding be taxed against the Respondent.

It is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that jurisdiction of this cause be retained for such orders and decrees as may be necessary and proper in and about the administration of the said estate of G. A. White, deceased.

It is also ordered, that a copy of this decree be recorded in the ~~minutes~~ Records of the said probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama.



And now comes the Respondent, GRACE V. ALLEY, and respectfully represents and shows unto your Honor and this Honorable Court as follows:

1. That on to-wit, July 30th, 1937, there was filed in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, in Equity, a suit, by S. C. Jenkins and Jesse F. Hogan, as Solicitors for Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White against the Respondent, Grace V. Alley, formerly known as Grace V. White, individually and as Administratrix of the Estate of G. A. White, deceased.
2. That there is in the file the original of summons issued by the Register of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, on July 30th, 1937, to Grace V. Alley; that there is on said summons what purports to be a return, as follows: "Executed this 4 day of Sept., 1937, by leaving a copy of the within with Grace V. Alley, Defendant. Fred H. McDuff, Sheriff, By Tony Schellids, Deputy Sheriff".
3. That on November 8th, 1937, the Register of the Court entered a Decree Pro Confesso on Personal Service against the said Grace V. Alley.
4. That on November 16th, 1937, S. C. Jenkins and Jesse F. Hogan, as Solicitors for the Complainant, filed a request that the cause be submitted for final decree on the Bill of Complaint and the Decree Pro Confesso and evidence as noted by the Register.
5. That there was filed, on the 19th day of November, 1937, an order of the Court that said cause be submitted for final decree upon the original Bill of Complaint, Decree Pro Confesso and evidence as noted by the Register, a written request having been filed by the Complainants.
6. That on the 18th day of November, 1937, a decree was entered in this Court granting the relief prayed for in the original Bill of Complaint.
7. That the Respondent was, at the time of the filing of the original Bill of Complaint, and is now and has been continuously since that time, a resident of Jefferson County, Alabama; that she has, during all of said time, had as her attorney, Hon. Jim Gibson of Birmingham, Alabama, and that there



is noted on the original summons "See Jim Gibson for add."; that no notice of any kind or description, or a copy of the summons was, on the 4th day of September, 1937, served upon her by Tony Sibillis, nor any other person, nor did she have any notice of the pendency of the said suit until just recently; that she has a perfect, complete and good defense to the above suit filed against her in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and that if she had had notice of the pendency of said suit she would have entered her appearance and defended her rights thereunder; that the material allegations contained in the original Bill of Complaint are untrue and that if given an opportunity to appear and defend her rights in Court, it can be shown that the allegations thereof are formulated and untrue; that in the decree of the Court it was expressly provided "it is also ordered, adjudged and decreed that jurisdiction of this cause be retained for such orders and decrees as may be necessary and proper in and about the administration of the said estate of G. A. White, deceased."

WHEREFORE, the Respondent respectfully prays that your Honor and this Honorable Court will set aside and hold for naught the decree rendered in the above styled cause, on the 18th day of November, 1937, and that she be permitted to come in and file her appearance and that an order be entered restoring the said proceeding to the active docket of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and there be treated and handled as a pending case.

Leona White and Thomas Jefferson White are the mother and father, respective-  
ly, of the said G. A. White and are his only heirs at law; while the said  
Grace V. Alley is the widow of said G. A. Alley, having been formerly known  
as Grace V. White, and having intermarried with one, Alley, after the death  
of said G. A. White, and now being known as Grace V. Alley; that your




