**The Condition of this Obligation is such,** That whereas the above bounden

Horace Wilson has on the day of the date of these presents claimed an APPEAL to the Circuit Court, next to be held in and for the County of Baldwin, in the State aforesaid, at the next Term thereof, from a judgment rendered on the 3rd. day of April 19 46

by Howard Ruge Esq., Recorder of the Town of Fairhope and Ex-officio Justice of the Peace, in and for said Town, against said Horace Wilson requiring him to pay said Town of Fairhope Fifty-four and 75/100 Dollars, as a fine, or fifty-five days hard labor

NOW if the said Horace Wilson shall appear at said term of said Circuit Court, and from term to term thereafter until discharged by due process of law, then this obligation to be void, otherwise to remain of full force and effect.
