


Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared, F. W. Schettler, known to me, who being duly sworn upon his oath says, that he is the Credit Manager of the Malleable Iron Range Company, Beaver Dam, Wisconsin, and that as such, he makes this affidavit:

That on March 22, 1946, Phil Brady Electric Company ordered one #F156P MONARCH electric range for which the price was \$114.39, FOB Beaver Dam, Wisconsin; that we made shipment of this range to Phil Brady Electric Company on May 24, 1946 on terms of net cash in thirty days from date of shipment; that on December 2, 1946, Phil Brady drew a check #148 on the Bank of Fairhope, Fairhope, Alabama, payable to the order of the Malleable Iron Range Company, in the amount of \$114.39, to pay for this range, and which check was properly endorsed and forwarded to the Bank of Fairhope, Fairhope, Alabama, for collection, but the check was returned, marked "Returned account of insufficient funds", the protest fees amounting to \$2.00, and that there remains due and unpaid on said account, after allowing all due credits, the amount of this unpaid check \$114.39, plus the protest fees of \$2.00, or a total of \$116.39.

I am personally acquainted with these facts, because I am Credit Manager of the Malleable Iron Range Company, and am in a position to know that on March 6, 1947, the Phil Brady Electric Company still owed the Malleable Iron Range Company the amount of \$116.39, which amount remains due and unpaid.
