I am a practicing physician and surgeon located at Fairhope. With this I attach itemized statements of the services which I rendered as a surgeon, and which the Jordan Clinic owned by me, furnished to Robert Minor and Kenneth Murphree, from the time they were brought into the Clinic on the night of December 19, 1942 to the time when these gentlemen were discharged, and in the case of Minor plus three office calls. The aggregate of these is \$366.25. Both young men were brought to the Clinic December 19, 1942 suffering from serious injuries received from a car with defective lights driven by Defendant's son. They were placed on the operating table and given immediate attention. Murphree stayed in the Clinic, receiving hospitalization and treatment seven and a half days. Minor was there sixty-two days. In this time they were given the best of surgical care for which my charge is that prescribed by the Alabama Medical Association and is fair and reasonable. We do not itemize each visit to a patient's bedside, the medicines, bandages and supplies furnished or the meals furnished. These are included in the general Infirmary rate and in the charge for surgical treatment. Both men were seriously hurt and when brought to the Clinic, Minor was semiconscious, and both suffering from shock. No charge was made to these men, as Mr. Arnold Brodbeck, who came to the Clinic when the patients were brought in, expressly told me in the presence of the two men and of some of the nurses, not to do this, but give them the best of care and attention for which he, and not the patients would pay. At this request, I did so and made no charge to either patient. Later I sent Mr. Brodbeck bills but had no response. Later when my lawyer notified him that the account was in his hands, his counsel Mr. Blackburn requested that no

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action be taken the, as payment by Brodbeck might prejudice him in any damage suit that might arise. Later on, copies of this statement were sent Mr. Blackburn at his request, with the four-teenth letter that Mr. Rickarby had written him, asking that the account be settled. It was, however, only just before this suit was brought that the Defendant disclaimed liability.
