

The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant TWELVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (\$1250.00) DOLLARS, as damages, for that heretofore on to-wit, November 21st, 1948, the Plaintiff was riding in an automobile along highway number 90, a public highway in Baldwin County, Alabama, at a point approximately one half mile west of Spanish Fort, that at said time and place the Defendant negligently drove an automobile into or against the automobile in which the Plaintiff was riding; and as a proximate result of the negligence on the part of the Defendant, the Plaintiff was injured as follows:

He was knocked unconscious; he was caused to suffer severe physical pain and mental anguish; his legs were bruised and made sore; he was caused to lose time from his work; he was caused to incur doctor bills; he was caused to incur medicine bills, he was permanently injured; hence this suit.

The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant TWELVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (\$1250.00) DOLLARS, as damages, for that heretofore on to-wit, November 21st, 1948, the Plaintiff was riding in an automobile along highway 90, a public highway, in Baldwin County, Alabama, at a point approximately one half mile west of Spanish Fort; that at said time and place the Defendant negligently drove an automobile into or against the automobile in which the Plaintiff was riding, and as a proximate negligence on the part of the Defendant, at said time and place the automobile of the Plaintiff was injured as damaged as follows:

The radiator bent and broken; the fender bent; the hood bent; the lights broken; the front wheels bent and broken; the front axle bent; the frame bent; the glasses broken; the springs bent; and otherwise damaged; hence this suit.


