Now comes the Plaintiff in the above styled cause and amends the Bill of Complaint heretofore filed by him by adding thereto Count ~~Three~~ <sup>FOUR</sup> as follows:

The Plaintiff further alleges that on or about August 16, 1949, he was requested by Frank Kaiser, the son of the Defendant, to do certain work on the North half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 7 South, Range 5 East, in Baldwin County, Alabama, which land is owned by the defendant, and that, acting upon said request of the said Frank Kaiser he did render valuable and useful services to the said Defendant in that he greatly improved the above described land by constructing a drainage ditch thereon and spreading dirt to level up the said land and by removing trees from the same, all of which was beneficial to the Defendant, Paul Kaiser, Sr., and which he has refused to pay for. The Plaintiff further alleges that the said Paul Kaiser, Sr. knew that said improvements were being placed on his land and that the services referred to above were being rendered and that he knowingly and voluntarily accepted the services as rendered by the Plaintiff and as set out above. The Plaintiff further alleges that the sum of Eight Hundred Thirty-seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$837.50) is a reasonable sum for the services rendered by the Plaintiff for the benefit of the Defendant and which were knowingly and voluntarily accepted by him and that the said Defendant has refused and continues to refuse to pay to the Plaintiff the reasonable value of such services, hence this suit.

heretofore filed by the Plaintiff says:

1. My name is Paul Kaiser Sr. I am 72 years of age. I am retired.
2. Yes.
2. Yes.
4. I did not.
5. Yes.
6. Approximately 75 acres, some of it is used for irish potatoes  
and some for corn.
7. I did not.
8. No.
9. I do not know. I was not present at the time of the conversation  
between Frank Kaiser and Joe Schneider.
10. I was not.
11. I do not remember the date the work was begun.
12. I did not authorize Frank Kaiser to employ Joe Schneider to do  
any work. Frank Kaiser was not acting within the line and scope of his  
authority as my agent, if he entered into the purported agreement with  
Joe Schneider.
13. I knew nothing about the U. S. Soil Conservation Department  
paying half the costs of the drainage ditch, however, sometime after the  
work was completed Mr. Schneider told me that the United States Soil  
Conservation Department had paid \$400.00.
14. I knew nothing about any agreement between Frank Kaiser and Joe  
Schneider as to the price of digging the drainage ditch. The first I  
knew about it was long after the drainage ditch has been completed.
15. I knew nothing as to the amount that the United States Soil  
Conservation Department was to pay Mr. Schneider.

16. I knew nothing about any agreement between Frank Kaiser and Joe Schneider as to spreading dirt or pushing trees until after the work had been completed.

17. I knew nothing about the amount that Mr. Schneider was to be paid.

18. I did not see any bill rendered Frank Kaiser by Joe Schneider.

19. Sometime after the work was completed Mr. Schneider came to my place at Dillian and told me of the amount due. This was the first time I had any knowledge as to the amount.

20. Mr. Schneider showed me a statement, however, he did not deliver it to me.

21. I did not agree to pay any amount.

22. I did not agree to pay the amount.

23. I did not employ Mr. Schneider to dig the ditch and I owed him no part of the bill. Mr. Schneider stated to me that there was a balance due of approximately \$800.00.

24. I have not paid Mr. Schneider anything.

25. Approximately 75 acres.

26. None of the land was under water except for a short time after a heavy rain when the water collected in a low place.

27. (a) Approximately 75 acres.

(b) There is none of it under water.

(c) Approximately the same acreage has been cultivated all the time.

28. (a) I don't know, however, I believe they did, I was not there.

(b) About a year or more before the digging of the ditch I did talk with Mr. Turner and Mr. Johnson about a ditch, however, not about the ditch under consideration.

(c) I did not.

29. In talking with Mr. Turner and/or Mr. Johnson relative to another ditch I was advised that I could get Federal Assistance, however, there was no conversation as to getting Federal Assistance in digging the ditch under consideration.

30. I do not know. It must have taken two or three weeks.

31. I did not discuss the work with my son and did not give him instructions as to how the work was to be done.

32. I did not go out to the farm to see how the work was progressing.

33. I did not.

34. I did not give any employee of Mr. Joe Schneider any instructions.

35. None.

36. I do not know the man's name employed by Mr. Schneider.

37. (a) I did not.

(b) He did not. I had no agent authorized to have the work done.

38. I know nothing about what my son Frank Kaiser told Mr. Schneider. He had no authority from me to tell him anything.

39. I did not authorize Frank Kaiser to make any agreement with Mr. Schneider.

40. I did not.

41. I know nothing about any agreement as to payment. I made no agreement as to any payment. I did not owe Mr. Schneider anything.

42. I did.

43. I did not.

44. I did.

45. Mr. Schneider showed me a statement, however, he did not give me a copy of the statement and did not mail me a copy. I owed him nothing.

46. (a) I did.

(b) I did.

47. I did not. I did tell Mr. Schneider that if I had made any arrangements as to digging a ditch I would have tried to get the adjoining land owners to join in the work and to bear a part of the expenses. I <sup>at</sup> did not/any time employ Mr. Schneider to do the work, nor did I authorize any one else to employ him.

48. I did.

49. He did not. I talked with Mr. Schneider only one time at my home in Lillian. This was a long time after the work was completed.

50. I don't remember ever talking with Mr. Schneider in Elberta.

51. I am not farming the land. My son Frank Kaiser is farming it.

52. I am reaping no benefits. If there is any benefits reaped it is by my son, Frank.

53. I have paid no part of the bill. I do not know whether any amount has been paid by other parties.

INTERROGATORIES FILED BY THE PLAINTIFF TO THE DEFENDANT.

Now comes the plaintiff and files the following interrogatories to the defendant, to be answered in writing under oath by him, fully and not evasively, within the time required by law:

1. State your full name, your age, and your occupation.
2. Are you the owner of the following described tract of land in Baldwin County, Alabama: The North Half (N $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the Southwest (SW $\frac{1}{2}$ ) Quarter of Section Twenty-three (23), Township Seven (7) South, Range Five (5) East?
3. Are you the father of Frank Kaiser?
4. On or about the 16th day of August, 1949, did you instruct the said Frank Kaiser to have a drainage ditch dug across the above described property?
5. Is the above described property farm land?
6. If your answer to interrogatory 5 is in the affirmative, how much of the land is now under cultivation, and what kind of crops are now being raised on the said property?
7. On or about the 16th day of August, 1949, did you instruct your son, Frank Kaiser, to contact Joe Schneider to employ the latter to dig a drainage ditch across your farm, above described?
8. Did Frank Kaiser, on or about the 16th day of August, 1949, employ Joe Schneider to dig a drainage ditch across your farm, above described, in accordance with your instructions to Frank Kaiser?
9. Did Frank Kaiser enter into a contract with Joe Schneider, authorizing Joe Schneider to dig a drainage ditch across your farm and to spread some dirt across the farm to even up the land?

10. If your answer to interrogatory 9 is in the affirmative, was the said Frank Kaiser acting upon your instructions?

11. Did the said Joe Schneider begin the work of digging the ditch on or about the 23rd day of August, 1949?

12. If Frank Kaiser employed Joe Schneider to dig a drainage ditch across your farm, above described, was the said Frank Kaiser authorized by you to employ the said Joe Schneider in such capacity, and if so, was the said Frank Kaiser then and there acting within the line and scope of his authority as your agent?

13. If the said Frank Kaiser employed Joe Schneider to dig a drainage ditch across your farm, above described, was half the cost therefor to be paid by the United States Soil Conservation Department?

14. What was the amount which was agreed upon between the said Frank Kaiser and the said Joe Schneider as the consideration for his digging the drainage ditch? In your answer to this question, do not include the amount that was to be paid by the United States Soil Conservation Department?

15. In addition to the amount stated in interrogatory 14, what was the amount that the United States Soil Conservation Department was to pay for each cubic yard of dirt that was dug by the said Joe Schneider?

16. Did the said Frank Kaiser, on or about the 25th day of August, 1949, employ the said Joe Schneider to spread dirt to even up the land on the farm, above described, and to push out some trees, to level the said land?

17. If your answer to interrogatory 16 is in the affirmative, what was the amount of compensation that the said Joe Schneider was to be paid for his services for spreading the said dirt and for pushing out the said trees; that is, what amount was he to be paid per hour?

18. Was a statement rendered Frank Kaiser by Joe Schneider for the work that was done on the farm, above described; the work meaning the amount due for digging the ditch and the amount due for spreading the dirt and pushing out the trees, as above described?

19. If your answer to interrogatory 18 is in the affirmative, what was the total amount of the statement that was rendered?

20. Was such a statement rendered to you?

21. If your answer to interrogatory 20 is in the affirmative, did you agree to pay the said amount to Joe Schneider?

22. If your answer to interrogatory 21 is in the affirmative, what was the date that you agreed to pay the said amount?

23. Was the total amount claimed in the said statement, rendered to Frank Kaiser, both for spreading the dirt and pushing out the trees, and for the amount of your part for the digging of the ditch by the said Joe Schneider, \$837.50?

24. Have you paid any part of the said \$837.50 due for the work done by Joe Schneider, as set out above?

25. Prior to the time that the digging of the drainage ditch commenced by the said Joe Schneider, how much of your said farm, above described, was under cultivation?

26. Prior to the digging of the said ditch across your farm, above described, how much land was under water?

27. Since the completion of the digging of the said ditch by the said Joe Schneider, (a) How much of your farm, above described, is now under cultivation? (b) How much of your said farm, above described, is now under water? (c) How much of the said farm land has been saved so that it could be cultivated by reason of the digging of the drainage ditch?

28. (a) Did Frank Turner, Baldwin County Agent, and Mr. Johnson, Assistant County Agent, survey the land prior to the digging of the said ditch, and stake it out, showing where the ditch should be dug? (b) If your answer to interrogatory 28.(a) is in the affirmative, did they recommend to you where the drainage ditch should be established on your farm, above described? (c) Did you authorize your son, Frank Kaiser, to have the said drainage ditch dug in accordance with the recommendations of the said County Agent, and/or the said Assistant County Agent?

29. Did you know that you would have Federal assistance, if the said drainage ditch were dug?

30. What was the length of time it took to complete the job of digging the said drainage ditch and spreading the dirt and pushing out the trees to level the land, above described?

31. Did Frank Kaiser, while the said work was going on and while the said Joe Schneider was performing his agreement, consult with you regarding the work, and did you give your son, Frank Kaiser, instructions as to how you wanted the said work done?

32. After Joe Schneider, and/or his employees, had commenced

digging the ditch, and after it had been dug for about 1,000 feet, did you come to the farm, above described, to see how the work was progressing?

33. If your answer to interrogatory 32 is in the affirmative, did you talk with Frank Kaiser, your son, while you were there on the farm, and instruct him how you wanted the work to proceed?

34. When you visited the said farm while the said work was going on, did you instruct Joe Philpot, in substance, to fill up a hole near the Southwest corner of the farm, and also instruct him, in substance, to let the other part of the ditch which runs along the South side of the farm go as closely as possible to the South fence, so that a bank would be built up on the South side, and so that the water from the land to the South of the farm, above described, would not drain on to your land, above described?

35. If you talked to the said Joe Philpot when you visited the said farm, as above stated, what instructions did you give him regarding the work?

36. Was the said Joe Philpot employed by Joe Schneider, and did he do some of the work which was agreed upon between your son, Frank Kaiser, and Joe Schneider, on or about the 16th day of August, 1949?

37. When you were visiting the said farm, as above stated, while the said work was going on, (a) Did you ask Joe Schneider, and/or any of his employees who were working on the said job, in substance, to build a bank along the West side of your farm, so that the water would not drain off the County road running along side your farm onto your land, above described? (b) If your answer to interrogatory 37.(a) is in the affirmative, did Joe Schneider, and/or any of his employees, tell you, or your agent, in substance, that it would not be right to block the County road, as it was a public road?

38. After the work was completed on the farm; that is, after the digging of the ditch and the spreading of the dirt and pushing the trees out, as above described, had been completed by the said Joe Schneider, and/or his employees, did your son, Frank Kaiser, tell Joe Schneider that he would be paid for the work as soon as your bean crop, then growing on the land, had been sold?

39. If your answer to interrogatory 38 is in the affirmative, did you authorize the said Frank Kaiser to make such agreement?

40. If your answer to interrogatory 38 is in the affirmative, did you ratify the said agreement after it had been made?

41. Was the date for payment to the said Joe Schneider for the work to be made by December 15, 1949?

42. Did Joe Schneider call on you for payment on or about January 15, 1950, at your house, at Lillian, Alabama?

43. Did you agree to pay him the amount that was due him?

44. Did you object to the work that he had done on your farm?

(a) Did you object to the amount that was due by the said statement?

(b) Did you ever complain that the work was unsatisfactory, and/or that the amount of the charges for the work made by the said Joe Schneider were too high?

47. When Joe Schneider came to see you at your house in Lillian, Alabama, to collect his money, did you tell him in substance to wait, that you would see whether you could get your brother, Mike Kaiser, to pay part of the Joe Schneider bill?

48. Did you ever deny owing \$837.50 for the work which was done on your farm, above described?

49. After Joe Schneider came to your house in Lillian, Alabama, to collect his money for the work done on your farm, did he again contact you at the Post Office in Elberta, Alabama, and ask you again for the money that was due him?

50. Did you deny, at that time, that you owed Joe Schneider \$837.50, the amount due for the work done on your farm, above described?

51. Are you now farming the land, above described?

52. Are you now reaping the benefits from the digging of the ditch and from the spreading of the dirt and pushing out of the trees on your farm, above described?

53. Have you, or your agent, paid any of the amount due for the said work performed by Joe Schneider, and/or his employees, on your farm, above described. If your answer to interrogatory 53 is in the affirmative, then attach receipts for said payments, or cancelled checks, showing that said payments have been made, if any, to your answers to these interrogatories.
