Your orator respectfully represents that he is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and has been for more than three years next preceeding the filing of this Bill; and that he is over twenty one years of age and That the respondent, Myrtle Grubbs, is a resident of Escambia County in the State of Florida and is over twenty one years of age.

2nd.
