COUNT ONE:

The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) as damages for that, whereas, on to-wit, January 22, 1952, at about 3:00 o'clock P.M., at a point approximately six miles East of the city limits of Bay Minette, Alabama, on United States Highway #31, in Baldwin County, Alabama, an automobile truck owned by the Plaintiff was being driven Eastwardly along such highway and while the Defendant was driving his automobile Eastward along such highway and after the driver of the truck owned by the Plaintiff had blown his horn signaling that he was about to pass the Defendant, the Defendant negligently drove his automobile across the center line of such highway and directly in front of the truck owned by the Plaintiff causing the same to collide with the truck owned by such Plaintiff and as a proximate result and consequence of the negligence of the Defendant the automobile truck owned by the Plaintiff was damaged in this: its left front fender was badly bent;

its bumper was bent; a spring was broken and two tires were ruined and it was otherwise damaged and the Plaintiff was caused to lose the use of such truck for two days, which said truck was then being used in the business of the Plaintiff as a commercial vehicle, all to the damage of the Plaintiff in the sum aforementioned.

- (c) Were you the owner of such Buick automobile at the time of the accident?
- (d) Were you traveling Eastward along such highway immediately before the accident?
 - (e) At what speed were you traveling?
- (f) Please give the name and address of any person or persons who were in such automobile with you.
- 2. Please state whether you had been drinking any intoxicating liquors on the day of such accident.
- (a) If you state that you had been drinking intoxicating liquors that day, please state what you had been drinking and the number of drinks you had taken that day.
- (b) Is it not a fact that you had in such automobile at the time of the accident one or more bottles of whiskey, a part of which had been consumed and that you also had coca colas?
- (c) Is it not a fact that immediately after the accident occurred that you carried such whiskey across the road and placed it in the woods near the highway?
