COUNT ONE:

The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant, W. L. Hammond, individually and doing business as Hammond's Grocery, Robertsdale, Alabama the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) as damages for that on to-wit, February 23, 1952, the Defendant W. L. Hammond, who was on said date then engaged in the operation of a grocery store in Robertsdale, Alabama, so negligently maintained the store building and machinery used therein for the convenience of the customers in said store as to cause or allow the said Althea Anntonette Brill, to be injured by said machinery in this: That the said Althea Anntonette Brill was, on said date, in said store operated by the Defendant, W. L. Hammond, accompanied by her mother, Marie Brill, and her sister, Suellen Brill, and that while her mother was engaged in purchasing groceries offered for sale by the said W. L. Hammond to the general public and while she was in said store as an invitee

of the said W. L. Hammond, the grocery basket in which she had been placed by her mother overturned and caused the said Althea Arntonette Brill to fall upon a concrete floor in said building and she thereby suffered great damages in that her head was injured and it was necessary that she receive medical care and undergo an operation for the removal of fluid which accumulated in her head as a result of said fall. The Plaintiff further alleges that said injuries were a direct and proximate result of the negligence of the defendant, W. L. Hammond, individually and doing business as Hammond's Grocery, Robertsdale, Alabama, in maintaining in said store machinery which was unsafe for the uses and purposes to which the same was put, all to the damage of the Plaintiff, aforesaid.
