JUDGE'S FINDING OF FACT

The court is of the opinion that the plaintiff, A. B. Johnson, suffered an injury to his back on or about May 2, 1969, in the course of his employment and while working for the defendant. The plaintiff was hospitalized for five days after the accident and incurred medical, doctor and hospital bills during said period and thereafter as the result of the said accident, which the court finds to be reasonable and proper.

The court further finds from the testimony that plaintiff was totally disabled for a period of five days and could not perform any work during said period of time.

The court, therefore, finds that plaintiff was totally disabled as a result of the accident which occurred on May 2, 1969, for a period of five days and is entitled to be compensated for doctor, medical and hospital bills during said period of time thereafter as a result of the said accident, but is not entitled to compensation for lost wages.

AWARD

This cause coming on to be heard on the 6th day of February, 1970, before the Honorable Telfair J. Mashburn, Judge, upon the original complaint, the answer to the same and the oral testimony of the plaintiff in open court and the entire record from all of which the court finds as follows:

A. That the defendant is an employer within the meaning of the Workmen's Compensation Law of the State of Alabama.

B. That the plaintiff on May 2, 1969, was an employee within the meaning of the Workmen's Compensation Law of the State of Alabama and was covered by the act.

C. That on May 2, 1969, the plaintiff sustained injuries by accident arising out of and in the course of his employment with the defendant; that the defendant had actual knowledge of the said accident; that the plaintiff was hospitalized at Doctors Hospital, Mobile, Alabama, for a period of five days and that his hospital bill for said period was \$256.95; that the plaintiff was treated by Dr. Kenneth Hannon as a result of the said accident and the amount of this doctor bill was \$78.00; that the plaintiff was treated by Dr. Mudd, as a result of said accident, in the amount of \$55.00; that the plaintiff expended for medicine in treatment about his injuries, as a result of the accident, the sum of \$21.24, making a total expenditure of \$411.19 for doctor, medical and hospital bills which the court finds to be reasonable and proper, for all of which expenses the plaintiff is entitled to an award against the defendant, it having been made to appear to the satisfaction of the court that all of said expenses are reasonable and were necessary.

D. The court further finds that the plaintiff was

temporarily totally disabled for a period of one week from May 2, 1969, and since the disablement was for a period not more than one week, the plaintiff is not entitled to compensation therefor.

It is, therefore, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the above findings of fact be and they are hereby made the orders of this court and that the plaintiff have and recover of the defendant medical expenses in the sum of \$411.19 and the above award shall be due and payable upon the entry of this decree.

It is further ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the court that the plaintiff's attorney, James R. Owen, be and he is hereby awarded a lien against all of the aforesaid recovery in the amount of fifteen percent (15%) of said recovery as his statutory attorney's fee for the professional services rendered in representing the plaintiff in this cause.

The costs of this proceeding will be taxed against the defendant.

C O M P L A I N T

Plaintiff, A. B. Johnson, claims of the defendant, Mobile Press-Register, Inc., a corporation, workmen's compensation benefits arising out of the following facts, to-wit:


1. That he was on May 3, 1969, a resident and citizen of Baldwin County, Alabama, and a workman or employee employed by Mobile Press-Register, Inc., a corporation, which is a corporation doing business in said county and state.

2. That on said May 3, 1969, while working for said defendant, your petitioner was hurt while bending over to retrieve a paper and suffered serious injuries to his back and he sustained a temporary permanent disablement of body and petitioner avers that his said injuries arose out of and on account of his employment by the defendant, which was subject to the Workmen's Compensation Law of Alabama at the time and place of said accident.

3. That your petitioner has a wife who is wholly dependent on him and that his average weekly wage was, at the time of the accident and for a long period theretofore, not less than \$161.00 per week.


4. Plaintiff avers that his employer, Mobile Press-Register, Inc., a corporation, had prompt and immediate notice of said accident and that no compensation or medical expenses have been paid by the employer to petitioner.


