Humbly complaining, Your Oratrix, Jesse May Davis, respectfully - represents unto your Honor as follows:-

That your Oratrix, the said Jesse May Davis, and Osie Davis, the repondent in said cause, were legally married, to towit, June 7th, 1929 in Monroe County, Alabama and they lived together as husband and wife until about four years ago, when they separated while they were living at Perdido, Alabama, in Baldwin County and that they have not lived together since said time as husband and wife. Both your Oratrix and the respondent are bona fide citizens of Baldwin County, Alabama and have been so for more than three years prior to and preceeding the filing of the Bill of Complaint in this cause; that they are both over the age of twenty one years and both reside at Bay Minette, Alabama in the said Baldwin County, Alabama.

That after the marriage between your Oratrix and the respondent, the respondent, the said Osie Davis, became addicted to drink and when he got drunk or was drinking heavily, he would beat and treat your Oratrix most cruelly: His conduct became such towards your Oratrix that she had a reasonable apprehension of great personal violence and harm to her such as would endanger her health and life and as a consequence, Your Oratiex was forced to leave the respondent, which she did about four years ago and since said time she has not lived with him at all. shows further to your Honor that for more than two 3. Your Oratrix years prior to and preceeding the filing of the Bill of Complaint in this cause, the respondent, the said Osie Davis has not contributed snything at all towards the support and maintenance of your Oratinx either money goods or supplies of any kind and even before she, the said Jesse May Davis, left or separated with the respondent, the said Osie Davis, had failed to give her a support and often she had to leave him and go to her fathers home to get the actual necessaries for life . Wherefore, the premises considered, your Oratrix, the Jesse Way Davis, prays that a subpoena be issued and directed to the

said Osie Davis, the respondent in this cause; that he be brought into

-this Honorable Court; that he may be made a party defendant to the Bill of Complaint filed in this cause and that upon a final hearing of the - evidence in this cause and at a final hearing therein, your Honor will order, adjudge, and decree that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between your Oratrix and the respondent, the said Osie Davis, be forever dissolved and that your Honor will, also, order, adjudge, and decree that your Oratrix be permitted to marry again and that she be granted such other and further relief as may in equity and good conscience seem meet and proper to your Honor.
