



The Plaintiff claims of the Defendants the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) as damages for that heretofore on, to-wit: the 21st day of January, 1969, at approximately 3:11 P. M. at a point on U. S. Highway No. 31 opposite Still Motor Company in the City Limits of Bay Minette, Baldwin County, Alabama, the Defendant Ayre Sue Little, who was then and there the agent, servant or employee of the Defendant Ayres C. Little, and at said time and place, acting within the line and scope of her authority as such agent, servant or employee, so negligently operated a

motor vehicle as to cause or allow the same to run into, upon or against a motor vehicle belonging to and being operated by the Plaintiff and as a proximate result of said negligence, the Plaintiff's vehicle was severely damaged in that its grill, front fenders, hood and its left side were bent, damaged or broken, the Plaintiff received severe personal injuries in that his left hand or wrist was broken and he received a severe blow to his head causing lacerations and an injury to his neck or spine; the Plaintiff was caused to endure much pain, suffering and anxiety and was caused to incur large hospital and medical bills and expenses in connection with his care and treatment and it is not certain at this time whether or not the injuries to the Plaintiff are permanent in nature; the Plaintiff was further caused to lose much time from his employment, all of said injuries being the proximate result of the negligence of the Defendants as aforesaid in the sum above mentioned, hence this suit.
