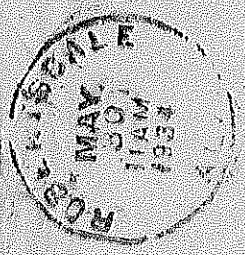

The above named witnesses being first duly sworn to tell the truth upon examination by E. G. R  tkarby, Esq., solicitor for Complainant, testified as follows:

ETHEL L. HYDE

I am the Complainant in this case and at the time this bill was filed was over the age of twenty-one years and am now and have been for the past five years or more a bonafide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama. I am a native of Alabama.

On December the 11th 1921 I was married to Hubert Hyde at Garland in Butler County, Alabama. He was over the age of twenty-one years at the time and has been all of his life a resident of Alabama. For the past five years he lived in Baldwin County. During our married life we have had two children, Yvonne now twelve years of age and James Hubert eleven years old.

During the year 1933 Hubert started going with a girl in Robertsdale named Dorothy Ard and after a little while left me and the children and took up with her. When I first knew of this we had words and he promised to do better but soon after resumed his relations and in August 1933 the pair of them left for Pensacola where they lived together as husband and wife. Later they moved to Belzoni Mississippi where she went by his name and gave it out that they were married. This last misbehavior I have not condoned in any way nor have I had any marital relations with him since He and she continued to live together till he was arrested about the first of the year 1935. Since then he has not been at liberty but she visited him in jail up to the time he was sent away. His adulterous relations with Dorothy were well known to practically every one in Robertsdale

For the last three years Hubert Hyde has done nothing for the support of our children who are now living with their grandparents who are really looking out for them for I have been able to do but little for them. I am now working and supporting my self but have had nothing from him since he starting living with Dorothy.

MRS. ELLEN HARRELL

I am a resident of Robertsdale and in August 1933 Hubert Hyde and his wife lived almost across the street from my home. For some time before that he and she had had trouble over a girl named Dorothy Ard and had parted on that account but he had come back to his wife and was living with her and their two children until about the middle of August 1933-- I do not remember the exact date --when Hubert Hyde left with Dorothy and went to Pensacola where he and she lived together as husband and wife. Later they moved to Mississippi where I understand she went by his name as his wife. I saw them the morning they left. It was just about day-light and I saw Hubert and Dorothy drive off together in a car and I have never seen either of them since. A little while later Mrs. Hyde came over to my house and told me that her husband and Dorothy had been out together all night and that he had come by to tell her that he was leaving her for good. Since that time I know he has not been back and that she has lived separate and apart from him.

LEONIDAS OWENS

I knew that Hubert Hyde had been going with Dorothy Ard for some time before he left here with her and had seen him down at her house with her. When he came back to Robertsdale which he did in the Fall of 1934 I met him and he told me that when he left he did not intend to take Dorothy with him but when he went to tell her goodbye she said she was going too and went. That they went to Mississippi and that they w

Pensacola together and later to Mississippi and that they went as man and wife there and that she had been good to him and he was not going to leave her. That they had been together for more than a year.

I, Orvis M.
