IT IS, THEREFORE, Ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court, that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Complainant and Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved, and the said

is forever divorced from the said

Phylis Tate

for and on account of

Voluntary abandonment

as alleged in said Bill of Complaint;

It is further ordered, that the said Alexander Tate

be, and he is hereby permitted to again contract marriage, upon the payment of the costs of Court in this cause.

It is further ordered, that the said Alexander Tate

pay the costs herein taxed, for which execution may issue, and if such execution is returned "no property found," then execution for such costs may issue against the said Phylis Tate

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said Alexander Tate

shall not again marry except to said Phylis Tate

until sixty days after this date, and that if an appeal is taken within sixty days he shall not marry again except to said Phylis Tate during the pendency of said appeal.
