This cause coming on to be heard on April 29, 1971, the Court having taken the same under submission and before the Court had reached any conclusion as to the laws and the facts, it was made known to the Court by the attorneys that the parties had reached an agreement and settlement in this case for the lump sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred and no/100 (\$5,500.00) Dollars, the Defendant to pay the costs of the Court. The Court had heard the evidence and finds that the Plaintiff's son, Jimmy L. Silcox, and the B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, were both subject to the Workmen's Compensation laws of the State of Alabama on which was July 13, 1970, the date he was killed/and that Jimmy L. Silcox was an employee of B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, at said time, and that the accident which resulted in his death grew out of and in the course of his employment; that the deceased employee had only worked for the defendant approximately one week at the time of his death so he had no history of earnings with this company, but a similar employee doing the work he was doing would have earned approximately \$110.00 per week.

Prior to the time that the deceased employee took the job with the Defendant, which was approximately one week prior to his death, he had been living in the home of his mother,

the Plaintiff, and according to her testimony paying her \$30.00 per week room and board. She had on a previous occasion made an affidavit that he was paying her \$25.00 per week room and board. The Plaintiff owned her own home. Her husband contributed approximately \$10.00 every two weeks to maintaining the household. She receives food of the approximate value of \$75.00 per month from the Little River commodities. She was drawing social security for her two children by a previous marriage in the sum of \$96.00 a month. The evidence further shows that when the deceased workman went to work for the Defendant that there was no understanding or agreement that he would continue to pay room and board or contribute to his mother's support. Plaintiff's deceased son had had several jobs prior to taking the one with the Defendant, and in each of his applications for employment he had stated that he had no dependents. This is true of the application with the Defendant, B & B Construction Company.

Since the parties through their attorneys have advised the Court that they have agreed to settle this case for the sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred and no/100 (\$5,500.00) Dollars in a lump sum, it appears to the Court that it is to the best interest of the parties that this case be settled on this basis, and is in substantially the amount she would be entitled to under the Workmen's Compensation laws of the State of Alabama, the Defendant already having paid the sum of Four Hundred and no/100 (\$400.00) toward the funeral expenses of the deceased employee; and it also appearing to the Court that Taylor Wilkins, Jr., who is the attorney for the Plaintiff, Jennie Resmondo, is entitled to attorney's fees of

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED

BY THE COURT that the agreement between the parties heretofore mentioned and made known to the Court is hereby approved,
and when the said payment of \$5,500.00 shall have been made
along with the cost of these proceedings, the said Defendant,





The Plaintiff, Jennie Resmondo, claims of the Defendant, B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, a corporation, workmen's compensation benefits in the amount of FIFTEEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND NO/100 (\$15,400.00) DOLLARS, arising out of the following facts, to-wit:

That she is a citizen and resident of Baldwin County, Alabama. That she is the lawful mother of Jimmy L. Silcox, deceased, and was totally dependent upon said Jimmy L. Silcox, deceased, for her maintenance and support at the time of his death. That she is the mother of Johnnie Silcox and Ernest Silcox, each who receive the sum of FORTY-ONE AND 30/100 (\$41.30) DOLLARS per month as Social Security benefit payments.

II

The Plaintiff's son, Jimmy L. Silcox, deceased, age nineteen (19) at the time of his death, was employed by the Defendant, B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, as a laborer, and while performing his duties as a laborer an accident occurred arising out of and in the course of his employment, thereby resulting in his death from electrocution at approximately, to-wit: 11:00 am on July 13, 1970, at or near Linden, Marengo County, Alabama.

Plaintiff further avers that the Defendant is a foreign corporation, being domiciled in the State of Mississippi and having qualified to do business in the State of Alabama with the Secretary of State's Office on April II, 1969, and that on July 13, 1970, the Defendant, B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, was engaged in the construction of a building near the city of Linden, in Marengo County, Alabama, and that the deceased employee, Jimmy L. The Defendant, B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, on the aforesaid date, had and maintained in full force and effect a certain workmen's compensation insurance policy issued by the General Accident Group Insurance Company, through the terms of which the employees of B & B Construction Company, Incorporated, were insured against injuries and death arising out of and within the scope of their employment.

Plaintiff avers that on August 7, 1970, written notice was given to the employer of the deceased's death and said employer, furthermore had actual notice of the death of the employee.

Plaintiff avers and would show unto this Honorable Court that her

deceased son, Jimmy L. Silcox, was earning an average wage of ONE HUNDRED TEN AND NO/100 (\$110.00) DOLLARS per week and that your Plaintiff was entirely dependent upon the deceased for her support. Plaintiff avers that under and by virtue of the Workmen's Compensation Laws of the State of Alabama, that she is entitled to receive benefits of THIRTY-FIVE (35%) PERCENT of the average weekly wage of her deceased son subject to the maximum fixed by statute for a period of FOUR HUNDRED (400) WEEKS dating from said accident for the use and benefit of your Plaintiff and she further avers that she is entitled to FOUR HUNDRED (\$400.00) DOLLARS as funeral expenses which have been paid by the Defendant's workmen's compensation insurer.
