To the Honorable John D. Leigh, Judge of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama.

In Equity.

Will H. Zorn exhibits this his Bill of Complaint against, Eugene Oaks and James S. Oaks, and humbly complaining showeth unto your Honor:

First.

That Orator is over the age of twenty-one years and resides in the City of West Plains in the State of Missouri.

That defendants Eugene Oaks and James S. Oaks are each over the age of twenty-one years and reside in the City of West Plains in the State of Missouri.

Second.

Orator shows unto your Honor that on January 28th., 1915 the defendant Eugene Oaks obtained from Orator a loan of Twelve Hundred and fifty Dollars, for which he gave to Orator his note dated January 28th.1915 and payable one year after date with interest at eight per cent per annum from date at the Farmers Savings Bank of West Plains, Missouri: that for the purpose of securing the payment of said note, said Eugene Oaks endorsed and transferred to Orator a certain promissory note for Six Thousand Dollars made by said James S. Oaks, dated, December 21st 1914 and payable On or before five years after date, with interest at eight per cent from date at the Baldwin County Bank in Bay Minette, Alabama, said note for Six thousand Dollars is secured by a mortgage bearing even date with said note, on certain lands lying and being in Baldwin County, Ala-and particularly described in said Mortgage. bama/ Said Mortgage is dyly recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate Baldwin County, Alabama, in Mortgage Book 13 pages 675 and a copy of the same is hereto Attached, marked whibit "A" and made a part of this Bill of Complaint.

Third.

Orator further shows unto your Honor, that said note for Twelve Hundred and fifty Dollars made by said Eugene Oaks is past due and unpaid; some interest has been paid on it, and

entitled to certain other credits amounting to about \$200.00, but defendant Eugene Oaks has failed and refused to pay said note.

Orator is still the holder of said note for Six Thousand Dollars made by the said James S. Oaks to said Eugene Oaks and by the said Eugene Oaks endorsed and transferred to Orator, the same being secured by the Mortgage on certain lands in Baldwin County, Alabama, and the same is past due and unpaid.

Prayer for Process.

To the end therefore that equity may be done in the premises Orator prays that the states writ of subpoena issue out of this Honorable Court directed to said Eugene Oaks and James S. Oaks, commanding them and each of them to appear and plead, answer or demur to the foregoing Bill of Complaint within the time required by law and in accordance with the practice of this Court, also that a copy of this Bill be sent to each of said defendants by registered mail, addressed to each of said defendants at West Plains, Missouri, in manner and form as required by law.

Prayer for Relief.

And then may it please your Honor to take jurisdiction of this cause and by proper orders and decrees to require the defendants to pay the amount due your Orator on said note for Six Thousand Dollars secured by the mortgage aforesaid, and in default of such payment your Honor will order a sale of the lands described in said mortgage by the Register of this Court, that the proceeds of such sale be brought into this Court, and applied to the payment of the debt due Orator, including such reasonable attorney's fee as may be found right and proper, the costs of this Court and the expenses of such sale, and the balance if any to be paid to the defendants of such of them as may be entitled to the same, and that the equity of redemption of said defendants in said lands be forever barred: and that your Honor will grant to Orator such other further and different relief as he may be entitled to and as to your Honor may seem just and equitable.
