Sibley, his wife, both now deceased, by a deed recorded in Book & page 502-30f the Baldwin County Records, and a copy of which is hereby attached, conveyed to Austin E. Ledyard, Thomas P. Miller and Armstead M. Elgin, as trustees, Square Twelve of the Village of Montrose to be held by them for school purposes under conditions set forth in said deed.

SECOND: That on June 21st, 1911, the original trustees above named having died, a petition was filed in the Chancery Court at Mobile, then having jurisdiction of the territory where said school is located, requesting the appointment of three trustees in lieu of those originally named and in accordance with said petition, and, after due notice, an order was made by the Register in Chancery naming as such trustees to act without bond Harry Pillans, William D. Randall and Elliott G. Rickarby, which order was entered in Order Book No. 5, page 305 of the Chancery Records at Mobile, and a copy of which is also attached hereto.

THIRD: That William D. Randall, one of the trustees last named, departed this life in the latter part of the year 1918, leaving a vacancy in the Board of Trustees of said Montrose Academy.

WHEREFORE, the premises considered, Petitioners pray that, after due notice as required by law, an order be made appointing a third trustee to take the place of the late William D. Randall under the provisions of the deed of Sible as afore-

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said, and that such other orders may be made as shall seem proper in the premises.

Ledyard, Thomas P. Miller and Armstead M. Elgin, the receipt of which I do hereby acknowledge, have given, granted and conveyed, and by These Presents, do give, grant and convey unto them, the said Ledyard, Miller and Elgin, all and singular the following described lot of land, to-wit; lying and being in the village of Montrose, and in Baldwin County, Alabama, known and described as Square number twelve (12) according to a map or plan of said village surveyed and executed by Gavin B. Yuille now on record in Book E, page 388 in the Probate Court of Baldwin County; said square containing nine acres, more or less, and being bounded North by Lee Street, East by Third Street, South by Graham Street and West by Second Street. To Have and To Hold the said lot of ground unto them, the said Austin E. Ledyard, Thomas P. Miller and Armstead M. Elgin, and their successors forever. In trust, however, that the said ground is to be held by the said Ledyard, Miller and Elgin as t rustees and for the sole purpose of building and erecting thereon buildings and improvements necessary and proper for a male and female Academy or institution of learning and for no other purpose whatsoever, and from and after building and erecting all said houses and other improvements on said square, then to hold the same together with all improvements and appurtenances thereunto belonging for the sole use and benefit of the said institution by whatever name the same may hereafter be known or incorporated, and is fully understood that the said institution when established shall ever be open to the admission of scholars or students without reference to or creed and further that if the said buildings shall not have been erected and a school commenced on the square of ground within ten years from this date, or if after having been established the school

or institute shall for any cause be discontinued for ten consecutive years, then in every case this deed shall be null and void and of no effect and the title to the said square of land, towit, Square number twelve (12), shall revert to me or my heirs, and I, Eliza A. Sibley, wife of the said Cyrus Sibley, in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 to me in hand paid, the receipt of which I do hereby acknowledge have and do hereby release and forever relinquish unto them, the said Austin E. Ledyard, Thomas P. Miller and Armstead M. Elgin, trustees as aforesaid, and for the same purposes as aforesaid all my right of dower in and to the said lands and every part thereof.
